
Susan Noonan, president of Duchesne High School, to step down

In the three short years as president, she brought energy and commitment to the mission of Duchesne in shaping students in mind, body, and spirit, in the legacy of St. Rose Philippine Duchesne. While at Duchesne, she helped navigate the changes in All Things New with the Archdiocese of St. Louis, led the development of a new strategic plan, bolstered the enrollment and fundraising, and brought on a new principal and director of advancement.

"We truly appreciate Susan's efforts in strengthening Duchesne and building on the momentum for our future direction," said Duchesne Board Chair, Theresa Ruzicka. "We wish Susan well in future endeavors," she added.

Dear Senior Parent,

I hope the letter finds you well! As we enter the "home stretch" of this school year, we want to provide you with information regarding our Graduation Ceremony and the Baccalaureate Mass.

Baccalaureate Mass will be held on Tuesday- May 14 at St. Peter Catholic Church in St. Charles. The Mass will begin at 6 p.m. and will be followed by an award presentation in the church. Family is encouraged to attend the Mass in support of the graduates. Graduates will sit together at the front of the Church and family will fill the other pews. Doors to the church will open at 5:30pm. Dress code for this event is "Mass-appropriate".

The Graduation Ceremony will take place on Thursday- May 16 in the school gymnasium at 6 p.m. Each graduate will receive eight tickets to graduation. This will consist of four "Preferred Seating" tickets and four "General Admission" tickets. The gym doors will open one hour prior to the ceremony (at 5:00 p.m). Graduates are asked to dress up for the graduation ceremony. Please note that the ladies will be wearing white graduation gowns. A white or light-colored dress will not show through the graduation gown. If your child plans to wear high heels, please ask her to bring them to graduation practice on Wednesday.

Graduation from high school is an important event in the lives of students, parents, and families. It is an opportunity to celebrate the educational accomplishments of students. The graduation ceremony is designed to provide memories and impressions that will last a lifetime. We need your assistance to ensure the Duchesne Graduation Ceremony is conducted in a dignified manner. The faculty and staff have spent significant time planning and organizing this event. It is very important that all graduation participants and attendees conduct themselves in a polite and courteous fashion.

Students are reminded that their behavior at graduation ceremonies and rehearsals is governed by the school handbook's Code of Conduct. When crossing the stage, students will shake the hands of the stage guests, receive their diploma, and return to their seats. Inappropriate behavior on the graduation stage is strictly prohibited.

Graduation practice is mandatory. You will not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony if you do not attend practice. Graduation practice begins at 9:45 a.m. in the PAC on Wednesday, May 15. We will not begin practice until ALL seniors are present. Please be on time.

Finally, please take a moment to talk with your student about their service hours. As you know, Duchesne requires a minimum of 100 service hours to graduate. PLEASE verify the number of hours your child has logged so there are no surprises. ACT: 5 REASONS TO TAKE AN ACT PRACTICE EXAM

Taking a practice exam lowers your • anxiety. A lot of anxiety is simply your uncertainty about what the ACT test will be like. A practice test makes you familiar with the look, feel, and cadence of the exam. This familiarity wipes out your peripheral uncertainty about the test-taking experience, allowing you to focus on the content and problem-solving aspects of the exam.

A practice test gives you a baseline. \angle •Knowing your value baseline on the ACT or SAT performance is important. Let's say you're shooting for a 30 on your ACT. If your first practice score is a 27, that's a very, very different matter than if you come out batting 21. The bigger the gap between your baseline and your target, the more you'll need to prep - and the more time you'll need to give yourself to do it.

Taking a practice test builds endur- \mathcal{J}_{\bullet} ance. Sitting in one place answering questions for three hours wears you out. To get the highest score possible, you need to be as focused answering the last question of section 4 as you were answering the first question of section 1. The more practice tests you take, the more endurance you'll have on the real exam.

4. Test-taking is a skill to be elearned. Here's an interesting thing to consider: most students fear for their test-taking abilities, yet how many students actually practice taking tests? Issues such as test anxiety, which many students think are unavoidable and chronic, actually go away with practice.

5. Practice tests raise your search to look back on, learning scientists agree that the two best methods for learning something are flashcards and – you guessed it – practice tests. Taking a practice test and thoroughly reviewing it is a fantastic way to start boosting your ACT or SAT score, pure and simple. Make sure your prep includes at least one practice test to fully maximize your advantage over the competition on Test Day.

WELLNESS

Practice deep breathing exercises when you do not necessarily need them so that when you are feeling stressed and could benefit from it in the moment, you are already an expert at the type of deep breathing you want to utilize. You do not want to try deep breathing for the first time when you are in a high stress state.

Here is my favorite breathing technique to use:

4-7-8 Breathing

With this kind of breathing, you will breathe in for four seconds, hold your breath for seven, and exhale for eight:

1. Start with one hand on your heart and one hand on your belly as in the diaphragmatic breathing exercise.

2. Take one, deep slow breath from your belly as you feel your diaphragm slide down. Count to four as you breathe in.

3. At the top, hold your breath as you count to seven.

4. For eight counts, exhale through your mouth, emptying your lungs completely.


5. Repeat three to five times or until you feel calmer.
