'Problem-solving skills

'Scholars Academy' at Duchesne High School lets studen

Duchesne High School won't start its scholars academy until next school year, six months down the road, but enthusiasm already is building for the new program.

At the school's open house in November, rising juniors and seniors expressed interest in the academy but lamented that it's open to only freshmen and sophomores next year.

One student "was a little bummed," said lead teacher Dominic D'Urso, noting that students are "really excited about it."

Are they ever. Current freshmen Ethan Ankenbrandt, Emily Noonan and Connor Hopkins already have been accepted into the Duchesne Scholars Academy next year and are enrolling now for class, which for sophomores is a STEM class (science, technology, engineering and math).

In a couple of weeks, they'll be joined by incoming freshmen receiving invitations to apply for the academy in their school acceptance letters, which go out Friday, Feb. 5. The application process consists of reading, essay and interview components.

The freshman class is The Big History, a study about the history of science from the very beginning — aka the Big Bang. Fittingly, a Catholic priest — Fa-

ther Georges Lemaître — developed the theory of an expanding universe, later known as the Big Bang Theory.

Ankenbrandt called the academy "a really good opportunity" for students.

"They'll be doing projectbased learning where you're working toward solving a problem with a project, so that's really giving you the problem-solving skills you need for real life," said Ankenbrandt, who came from a public school system. In his short time at Duchesne, he appreciates

that the smaller class sizes "give teachers a lot more opportunity for individual attention.'

Classes for the Scholars Academy will range from 12 to 15 students. After learning the history of science as freshmen and problem-solving skills as sophomores, students will drive the learning as iuniors in a humanities course. They'll collaborate with the teacher to design the syllabus, with a voice in the questions addressed and the texts used.

"Which is really quite advanced," said D'Urso, a 2014

winner of an Emerson Excellence in Teaching award.

As seniors, the students will create a "capstone project," which the school describes as "a high school version of a university-level thesis." For this, they might draw on the humanities class or use an aspect of the STEM class, but they'll make the call.

The academy's approach to learning will be decidedly student-centric, as opposed to teacher-centric. Long gone are the days of teachers leading the learning by standing before students and lecturing. More and more, sophisticated teenagers today drive the learning process.

Hopkins contrasted the oldschool way of learning with the new way.

"Say, you have a problem, but there's a certain way to solve it; they give you that way and you memorize it," he said. "Instead, you choose a problem and you figure out how to solve it, which is more relatable to real life.

"It feels like it's a more practical kind of learning rather than just academic learning. It's more hands on and figuring things out."

The new way "allows students to take control of their learning themselves," Noonan said. "Even the honors program is like that, but this expands on it."

Akenbrandt agreed, saying, "This takes it further."

Which has been the idea all

along. The scholars academy developed over the past several years, with a goal of challenging top-flight students and pushing them to bigger and better things.

"The freshman and sophomore courses build up to the humanities and the capstone project," D'Urso said. "The students choose the work, and teachers guide them. We believe that this will encourage them to learn on their own.

"High school students have the same questions as college students have, but they don't have access to how to go about finding the answers. I see us as teachers as a means of helping them find answers. We let them drive the questions, and we give them avenues to pursue answers to those questions."

Thus, teachers will offer bright students the quality of "deeper learning," as principal Fritz Long calls it, versus merely heaping on the quantity of just more work.

"It isn't a matter of doing more math problems," Long said. "They don't need more work. They need a different kind of work where they take what they've learned and use it in different ways."


The benefit of this approach goes far beyond the classroom and education.

"This will help you do more with what you have later in life," Noonan said.

The only program of it's kind in our metro area Catholic schools, Duchesne's Scholars Academy got underway in the 2016-2017 school year, starting with freshmen and sophomores.

DUCHESNE STUDENTS SOAR WITH BRIGHT FLIGHT SCHOLARSHIPS



orrine Stulce, Kaitlynn Dutzy, Jake Hearst, and Brittany Krafft were among Duchesne's Bright Flight scholarship recipients for the 2015-2016 school year. Other DHS graduates who received this honor included: Kathy Condon, Will Fairless, Erin Hannegan McKee, Sebastian Macedo, Joe Phillips, Lee Swearingen, and Nick Thiele.

Students receiving Bright Flight scholarships must receive a 31 or higher on the ACT test, for which they are each awarded a \$3,000 renewable scholarship. Duchesne's Class of 2016 had 12% of their members named as Bright Flight scholars. This 12% is three to four times higher than the public schools in St. Charles County, which saw 3-5% of their seniors receiving the award.

DUCHESNE STUDENTS ARE WYSE WINNERS AS DHS = SCIENCE SUCCESS!



After winning the small school division at the Worldwide Youth in Science and Engineering (WYSE) regionals in February, Duchesne's team went on to compete at the sectionals in March. From there, three students moved on to the statewide WYSE competition in April at Missouri University of Science and Technology in Rolla, where Brittany Krafft took 1st place in Biology, Andrew Sweeso earned 1st place in English, and Nathan Logan finished in the Top 10 in Chemistry.

GREETINGS FROM THE DUCHESNE ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB (DAB)!

The Duchesne Athletic Boosters (DAB) is excited to support another year of successful and exciting Pioneer athletics. The DAB was formed in the 1960s to raise financial support for the school's athletic program, which at that time

consisted of three varsity men's sports:

football, basketball and baseball. Currently, the Duchesne athletic program includes 18 varsity and 16 JV men's and women's teams participating in 12 different sports, a club hockey team, two cheerleading squads, and the Diamondline dance team. We continue to assist with funding a portion of the growing financial needs for Duchesne athletics. The DAB's financial support is obtained

through a number of avenues, including DAB memberships, concessions, the football lottery, Oktoberfest, the grade school

basketball tournament, and donations.

In just the past few months, the DAB has provided: \$650 for new golf cart batteries; a new one-man football blocking sled; new blocking pads for the larger blocking sled; a newly installed press box floor; \$6,000 for permanent highway signage listing our 4-peat consecutive state championship girls soccer teams; \$15,000 toward the purchase of new fitness equipment; souvenirs for the girls soccer team to throw out from their float in the St. Charles Fourth of July parade; and new volleyball nets and standards. In addition, the DAB organized a crew to paint the new All-Student Fitness Center, saving Duchesne thousands of dollars in labor. Many thanks to the 25 different individuals who pitched in over three evenings to complete a job well done!

Currently, the DAB is working to establish a scholarship in the memory of one of Duchesne's most ardent supporters, Mr. Mel Plackemeier. This scholarship is to be funded through donations made in Mel's honor as well as contributions from the Plackemeier family and the DAB. Also, the former concessions manager, TJ Slattery '88, and the new concessions manager, Mark Meixner, have

recently performed an audit of both concession stands. Mark is undertaking the process of deep cleaning both areas and is repairing or replacing equipment as needed. Another project underway

is a plan to upgrade our DAB website to enhance the user's online experience.

These are just a few of the important tasks that we are looking forward to completing in the coming months.

Lastly, the DAB's single largest fundraiser, our football lottery, is in full swing. The annual football lottery goes a long way toward supporting our Pioneer athletes. It's fun, it's easy, and it provides 238 opportunities for you to win! Another way the DAB raises funds for Duchesne's athletes is by working a

booth at the annual Oktoberfest in downtown St. Charles. This year, we doubled our booth space, which means we needed twice as many volunteers (and hopefully raised twice as much money for our cause). Next up will be the grade school basketball tournament in December.

ALL-STUDENT FITNESS CENTER

This project started in April 2015, when "upgrading our weight room equipment" was named as a "fund-a-need" item at our annual auction. The project was so well received that it grew into a doubling of our old weight room space and changing of the project scope to become what is now our All-Student Fitness Center.

We raised about \$22,500 at the

auction for improvement of the weight room. Then the Dempsey family made a donation of over \$20,000 toward the project, to honor the memory of their mother, Peggy (Pedrucci) Dempsey '63 who passed away in 2013. Peggy was devoted to her faith, her family, and the community she cared for through her career as a nurse and later through Volunteers in Medicine. The Dempsey family thought the Fitness Center would be a fitting way to honor her memory, by promoting health and wellness and at the same time benefitting Duchesne High School, her alma mater. Subsequent to that significant donation, the family made additional contributions, as did others in our Duchesne community, bringing the total to over \$60,000, which allowed us to turn the space into a fitness center for all of our students.

Changing the project from new equipment to dou-


bling the space involved obtaining permits and moving walls. A general contractor was hired and professional services were donated by alumni **Steve Hollander** '75 and **Dan Plackemeier** '76, as well as by Duchesne parents Chris DeGuentz and Matt Schmidt. Over 25 volunteers also lent assistance. These contributions from our loyal Pioneer Nation helped to bring the

project to fruition, well exceeding our original hopes.

Our students are using the fitness center during and after school. They demonstrated the new equipment at an October 12, 2016, event which included a blessing of the space by Fr. Bob Burkemper of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish, a ribbon cutting by the Greater St. Charles Chamber of Commerce, and an official dedication with the unveiling of a plaque that acknowledges the contributions of Peggy Dempsey and her family, as well as those of our Duchesne Athletic Boosters and greater Duchesne community, all of whom helped to make the All-Student Fitness Center possible.

The All-Student Fitness Center is a great story of our Duchesne community coming together to fill a need and delivering beyond expectations.

COACH PATRICK TURNER — SOCCER SUCCESS AND HONORS ABOUNDING



s Duchesne High School's varsity boys and girls soccer coach since 2013, Patrick Turner '03, has met with an unprecedented amount of success in such a short time. In the four seasons he's coached


them, the lady Pioneers have won the state championship each time. The team's "4peat" performance set a state record as well as a school one.

Under Coach Turner's leadership, the Duchesne boys soccer program has thrived as well, winning two district titles and making one state quarterfinal appearance in his first three years as coach. In the 2015-2016 school

year, Coach Turner's boys were the AAA Conference champions, won their district championship, and went on to the Elite 8 in the state championship competition.

These coaching achievements have not gone unnoticed. Coach Turner was recognized as the private and parochial schools 2015 Girls High School Regional Coach of the Year at the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) national convention in Baltimore last January. Subsequent to that recognition, Coach Turner was named the Jimmy Dunn Memorial High School Coach of the Year by the St. Louis Soccer Hall of Fame. As last school year ended, Coach Turner received yet three more awards: Coach of the Year from the Archdiocesan Athletic Assocation; Coach of the Year for Missouri Class 2 soccer; and Coach of the Year from the National Federation of State High School Associations.

The Duchesne Christian Service Program has evolved significantly over the last few years. In 2014, for the first time, 100 hours of service were required for graduation, and then during the

2015-2016 school year, we began a Junior Week of Service with the graduating class of 2017.

In January, Alicia Bungum, our former director of campus ministry, matched junior students with 30 organizations that had committed to hosting our students for a week in May. Ending

the school year early with the seniors, the juniors spent one whole week, Monday through Thursday, six hours a day, at a non-profit organization in the St. Charles/St. Louis area. The goal of the week was for the students to experience the challenging and

rewarding day-to-day work of service and have the opportunity to interact with those who are in true need, following the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. It was a happy coincidence that

was very impressed by the organizations and the thought they had put into giving our students an authentic service experience.

The Monday after the week of service, the juniors returned to Duchesne for a half-day of refection.

Duchesne alumnus Dan Huss '92, a youth minister at Incarnate Word Parish in Chesterfield, came to speak to the students about how service is an important piece of becoming selfless for others and for God, even when it does not feel meaningful or seem meaningful. We concluded the morning of reflection with an all-school Mass celebrated by Bishop Edward Rice, one of his last Masses in St. Louis before he assumed his new role as bishop of the Springfield-Cape Girardeau diocese. During his homily, Bishop Rice reinforced with the whole school that in service, we serve Christ.

Having always had a strong service ethic among our students, that commitment continues to grow. Many of our students decided to go back to their assigned organizations to volunteer on their own over the summer.

SR. BETTY BRUCKER, HEALTH CARE HERO AND ST. PETER H.S. ALUM



Sister Betty Brucker, who served 16 years as president of SSM St. Mary's Health Center in Richmond Heights, died June 30, 2015, at The Sarah Community in Bridgeton at the age of 90.

She joined the order of Franciscan Sisters of Mary in the fall of 1942, after graduating from St. Peter High School, which was then across from St. Joseph Hospital in St. Charles. She received a bachelor's degree in nursing from Saint Louis University in 1951, and, while moving up the ladder to nurse administrator and later hospital administrator, she earned a master's in nursing education in 1959 and a master's in health administration in 1972, both from SLU.

She became president of St. Mary's Health Center in 1975. There, she helped establish the Doorways Interfaith AIDS Residence Program, a living area on the hospital's campus for people with AIDS who weren't well enough to go home.

In a 2004 interview with the Business Journal, Brucker said of the decision, "People said, 'You'll be known as an AIDS hospital.' I said, 'It doesn't matter. We saw a need."

After retiring in 1991 as head of St. Mary's Health Center, she was named executive director of Catholic Community Services for Catholic Charities of St. Louis by then-Archbishop John May. Before retiring from that role in 2003 after 11 years, she expanded the community service centers operated locally by the organization from eight to 11, added a health-care component and made sure they were fully funded.

She also was a former head of the Hospital Association of St. Louis, and served as a mission associate at SSM St. Joseph's Health Center and SSM St. Mary's Health Center, and on the SSM St. Mary's Health Center Foundation board, St. Louis City Health and Hospitals Board and Regional Health Commission.

Among the honors she received, in May 2003, Aquinas Institute of Theology awarded Brucker its Doctor of Humanities Honoris Causa.

She received a lifetime achievement award as one of the Business Journal's inaugural Health Care Heroes in 2004.

"It was a struggle. It would have been easier to drop down," Lee said. "But my father and my teacher, Mrs. McConowitz, said no. She met me before school, taking time out of the rest of her day."

Lee was able to continue in his A-level classes, thanks to her help. He credits her encouraging him to do well.

"Fifteen years later, I think, what if I'd taken the easy way out?" Lee said. "I wonder if I'd have been as successful. Done as well in college? I met my wife in college. Would I have known her?"

lowship. Accepted into the multigenerational mentoring program two years ago, Lee was matched with a seasoned community leader as his mentor and Darion Moore as his Achievers For Life mentee.

With both his family and his employer, Florida Blue, deeply committed to community involvement, Lee had the encouragement and flexibility to give one hour a week to a middle school student.

What Lee didn't know was that the matchup with Darion would become a tight partnership.

"The first year at Butler, we met about every week at school," Lee said. "I went in thinking that the program was about academics, but I learned that it wasn't always.

Sometimes, it was about listening and being an advocate.'

"He helped me to get better grades. I wasn't focused a lot," Darion said. He took Lee's encouragement to heart and is now on the A/B Honor Roll with civics as his favorite class.

When the school year ended, Lee extended his involvement with Darion through Big Brothers, Big Sisters, which allowed them to do different events outside of school.

"My favorite time was when we went to Dave & Buster's," said Darion.

PIONEER FUND

Duchesne's annual Pioneer Fund was given a boost this past school year, thanks to the Alumni Challenge Matching Grant funded by an anonymous donor. Every new or increased alumni donation was equaled. The result of the challenge did not rise above its \$30,000 cap, but we were able to garner an additional \$22,969 in matching funds that we would not have had without this extra support. God bless that alumnus!

The 2015-2016 Pioneer Fund yielded a total of \$108,747 from all sources - the Alumni Challenge Matching Grant, alumni, faculty and staff, advisory board members, parents, grandparents, and friends. Of that total, a little over one-third came directly from alumni, notwithstanding the challenge. While much appreciated, that \$39,000 represents only 3% of our total alumni from St. Peter/Duchesne High School.

President Chuck Nolan has issued a new challenge for the 2016-2017 school year: to double alumni participation in the Pioneer Fund. Dollar amounts from almost all constituency groups doubled last year, which was wonderful. Now it's time to double the number of people supporting Duchesne. No matter the level, we need your financial support. Imagine what we could do with twice as many contributors!

FAMILIES HELPING FAMILIES

Duchesne's new Families Helping Families Tuition Assistance Program is a major gift outreach designed to address the major need for tuition assistance. With our tuition of \$9,500 frozen for the 2016-2017 school year, Duchesne's tuition is among the lowest for Catholic high schools in the St. Louis Archdiocese. Still, meeting the challenge of tuition continues to be a hurdle for many.

The Archdiocese's Beyond Sunday campaign is trying to address that. With \$59 million of the \$100 million goal raised, Beyond Sunday is starting to make a real difference. More than 1,100 students are receiving financial assistance to attend Catholic schools during 2016-2017, thanks to the generosity of those who have supported Beyond Sunday.

At Duchesne, nearly one-fourth of our families applied for tuition assistance through Beyond Sunday. However, only 16 students were given financial aid through that program. Because the need for tuition assistance is so much greater than the available aid, we at Duchesne have invited alumni and parent families to pay it forward through a program we are calling Families Helping Families. FHF provides tuition assistance directly to current students whose families need some help.

To date, a dozen families have been approached. Half of those have answered our call, pledging between \$1,000 and \$5,000 per year for commitments ranging from one to 10 years. On behalf of our students, their parents, and our faculty and staff, we say Thank You to:

THE PASSING OF A LEGEND - MR. RON KJAR, DUCHESNE FACULTY MEMBER 1964-2007



Ron Kjar came to St. Charles in 1964, intending to pass through on his way to Chicago. When letting his dog out of the car, it ran into Duchesne High School and cornered the principal of the school. Fr. John

Hickel and Ron got into a discussion that led to him accepting a position as a teacher at Duchesne, where he taught American History, Political Science, Economics, and Western Civilization for college credit until his retirement in 2007. Mr. Kjar passed away on August 26, 2016.

Despite being a memorable teacher for five decades, Ron was best known for starting and moderating the Duchesne Key Club, a service organization affiliated with Kiwanis. During his long leadership of the group, Ron helped guide over 1,000 high school "Key Clubbers," inspiring them as to the importance of serving others. Due to his influence, the Duchesne Key Club has regularly been recognized as one of the top Key Clubs in the country. Ron was awarded the Key of Honor (the highest recognition possible for a club leader) in 1995. Ron also served as golf coach at Duchesne, where the team won three state championships during his tenure.

A memorial Mass and reception was held at Duchesne on September 8, 2016. More than 200 former students, colleagues, friends and community members celebrated Ron's unique personality and the contributions he made to so many students' success.

An anonymous donor would like our Duchesne community to raise \$100,000 to honor Ron and benefit the Ron Kjar Service & Scholarship Award, which was founded by Dr. Tom Schneider '80 about 20 years ago. With tuition assistance being our greatest need, increasing our funds for the Ron Kjar scholarship will enhance our ability to help more students at a higher level, and assure that we can continue to honor Mr. Kjar's memory with this scholarship well into the future.

The anonymous donor has challenged our Duchesne community to raise \$90,000; they will donate the remaining \$10,000 once that \$90,000 is met. All donations made as a memoriam to Ron Kjar will go toward this donor-initiated memoriam challenge. Thank you. 🜿
