President Paul Boschert '77 is pleased to announce the appointment of Caleb Johnson as the school's new Director of Community & Student Engagement and Girls Basketball Head Coach.

"One of the qualifications we were looking for when creating this new student engagement position was someone with a heart for listening, guiding, and helping students feel they belong. Caleb has a proven record of being that person for the students he's worked with," said Paul Boschert '77, Duchesne's President. "Caleb will be working with our school leadership to create a welcoming and inclusive environment

that reflects our values of Catholic education."

Additionally, Johnson will help plan and lead student life programming at Duchesne that promotes empathy, respect, and cultural understanding. He will also assist the Admissions team by building relationships with local schools and community groups to share Duchesne's mission with a wider audience. These responsibilities will be in addition to assuming the role of Girls Basketball Head Coach.

Johnson has over 10 years coaching experience, most recently as the assistant women's basketball coach at Millikin University, where the team finished 23-6, played in the first two rounds of the NCAA Division III Tournament, and was consistently ranked in the Top 25 nationally.

At Millikin, Johnson was nominated for the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's 30 Under 30 Award for top assistants under 30 years of age. Prior to Millikin, he was the boys basketball head coach at Elsberry High School for four years, where his accomplishments were recognized with Eastern Missouri Conference Coach of the Year and All-Area Coach of the Year honors.

"I am excited to welcome Caleb Johnson as our new girls basketball head coach," said Renee Moore '86, Duchesne's Director of Athletics. "With time spent coaching at both the high school and collegiate levels, he brings a wealth of experience that makes him an

excellent fit as a head coach at Duchesne. The positivity, empathy, and compassion he has shown as a coach are the same qualities that make Caleb a great fit as our new Engagement director as well."

Johnson holds a Bachelor of Science degree in University Studies from Morehead (KY) State University and a Master's Degree in Athletic Administration from Union College in Schenectady, NY.

"My goal as a coach is to be there for the students on and off the court while helping them to be confident, make strides toward improvement, and become their best version of themselves," Johnson said. "I think this approach will serve me well as Duchesne's Director of Community & Student Engagement, too. I hope to be a mentor students can turn to for understanding and to help build awareness."

"Maddie has experienced every level of Duchesne Volleyball – first as a player, and then as an assistant coach and head coach," Moore said. "She knows the pride of being a Pioneer and will bring enthusiasm and passion to our Girls Volleyball program, just as she's done for Boys Volleyball."

Krause began coaching volleyball at Duchesne as an assistant in 2021. She was named Boys Volleyball head coach in 2023. She was heavily involved in the program as a Duchesne student as well, playing Girls Volleyball and managing Boys Volleyball

all four years, from 2016 to 2020. Additionally, she managed Boys Basketball for three years.

A 2025 graduate of Lindenwood University, Krause has a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education with a minor in Coaching. While in college, Krause played for Arch Volleyball Club for a year and managed the LU Men's Basketball team for a season. In 2023, Krause spent a semester abroad at University College Cork, where she played Volleyball and was named 3rd middle in the 2023 Ireland intervarsities.

"I love being part of the Duchesne community. It has felt like my home since I was a freshman in high school," said Krause. "The volleyball program is especially near and dear to my heart – I've seen amazing progress in the last few years, and I'm looking forward to furthering my involvement in Duchesne athletics and helping to make Pioneer Nation even stronger."

Duchesne Board Matters

What a year! On July 1, 2024, we started the fiscal year with a new president, Paul Boschert '77, at the helm. We are so grateful Paul came out of retirement in 2020 to be the athletic director at Duchesne High School and then answered the call to be our next leader. We are blessed with his commitment to the Catholic faith, energy, compassion, and dedication to continue the mission of DHS.

The last two years have been a period of transition at Duchesne on multiple fronts. As a result of the St. Louis Archdiocese's All Things New strategic planning process, effective July 1, 2023, DHS (and all Archdiocesan-owned high schools) began to function as separately incorporated legal entities with boards of directors of limited jurisdiction. Before that, all those high schools were part of one legal entity and their respective boards were advisory, not governing. Bylaws were developed by the Archdiocese to outline the powers and procedures for operation of Duchesne High School as a new legal entity.

This change in governance comes at a pivotal time for Duchesne. We have a long, rich history and this now gives us the means to move forward with renewed purpose and enthusiasm for the future. Having a board of limited jurisdiction provides DHS with stronger, more local leadership and control to create: 1) a greater sense of empowerment and ownership by the school's constituencies, 2) a greater accountability for academic excellence, faith formation, and financial oversight, and 3) a greater focus on strategic planning for long-term sustainability.

We started in July 2023 with 10 board members and then added two more members in 2024. We recently voted and received approval to increase the maximum number of board members to 15. Our board members are giving their time, talent, and treasure to support Duchesne with strong leadership and oversight to help grow and sustain our school for another 100 years.

We are closing the 2024-2025 school year with gratitude to these board members, with a special Thank You to Terry Gravemann as he completes his 60th year of service to DHS. Terry has worn many hats for Pioneer Nation through the years, including those of teacher, dean of students, pres-

The board has four committees (other than the executive committee, which is comprised of the four officers):

- Advancement and Admissions
- Catholic Identity
- Finance and Facilities
- Governance

Some highlights from the last two years:

- Approved a three-year strategic plan with eight key areas of focus (domains) – academics, advancement, Catholic identity, enrollment, facilities, finance, governance, and student life. Each domain has an overarching goal supported by several objectives to achieve. (February 2024)
- Formed a committee to lead the search

process for a new president that resulted in the selection of Paul Boschert. (Spring 2024)

- Represented Duchesne in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, which traveled through St. Charles from St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church to the Shrine of St. Rose Philippine Duchesne and then to St. Peter Catholic Church. (July 2024)

- Established Duchesne endowment with the Roman Catholic Foundation of Eastern Missouri, an independent organization that works with donors, parishes, schools, and agencies to achieve their charitable and financial goals. Anyone can contribute to support DHS for years to come. (October 2024)

- Held a board retreat at the Shrine of St. Rose Philippine Duchesne. (January 2025) The freshmen class retreat in September will also be held there.

- Approved faculty pay scale for the next three years. (February 2025)

- Approved the purchase of indoor digital scoreboards in the gym. (February 2025) The external marquee recently erected and digital kiosk in the gym lobby were due to the generosity of two DHS alumni.

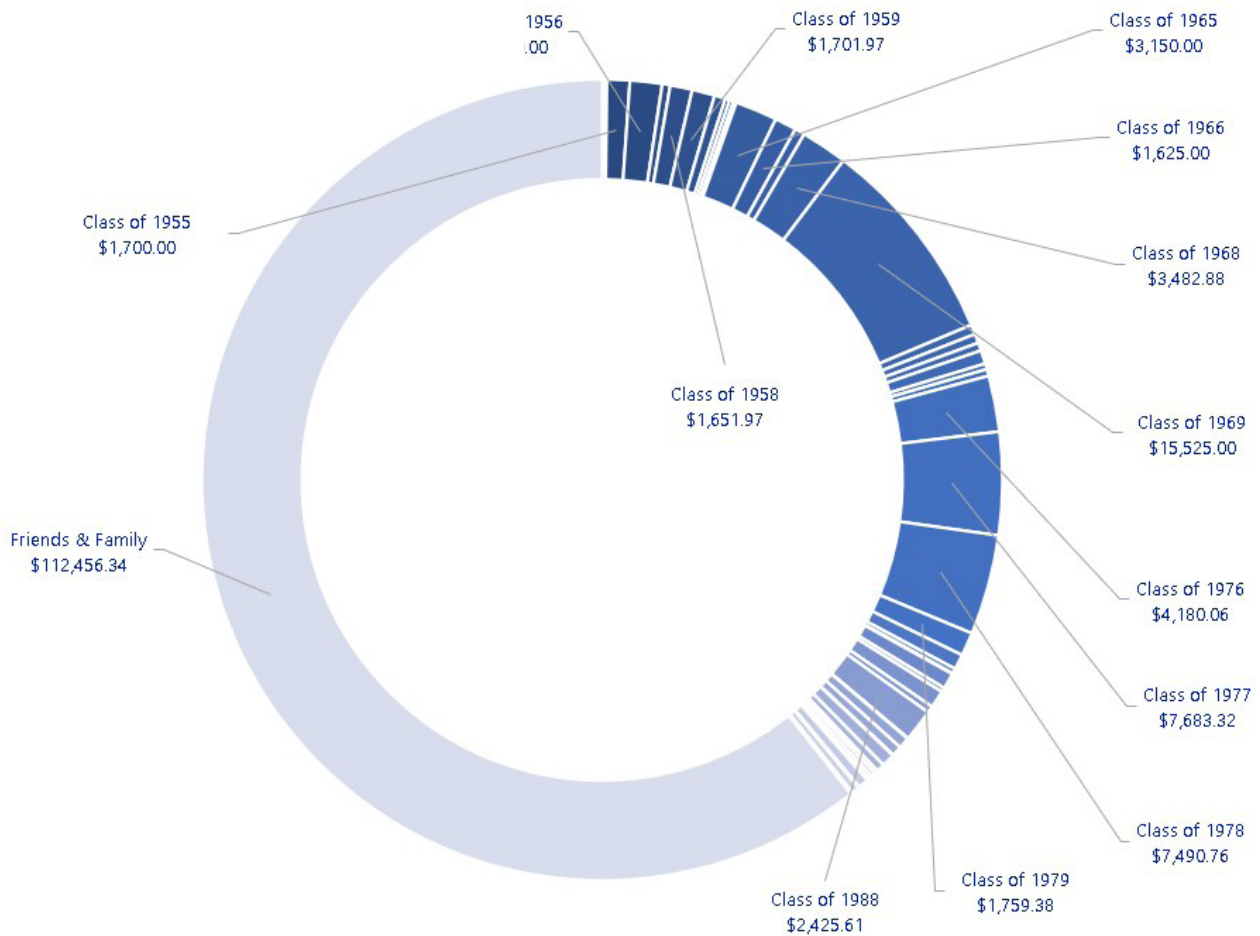
- Strengthened board effectiveness through development of governing policies and procedures. (Ongoing)

- Achieved 100% board giving with support of many fundraising initiatives – iGiveCatholic, Pioneer Fund, Pioneer Expedition Gala, and golf tournaments.

None of this could be achieved without the team efforts of the board; DHS alumni, parents, and friends; and the faculty and staff at Duchesne. On behalf of the DHS board of directors, we thank all of our stakeholders for your loyalty and support.

Duchesne has always been a special place with a welcoming family environment where people know each other and care about each other. We are committed to the mission of forming leaders in mind, body, and spirit for many years to come. Under the protection and guidance of St. Rose Philippine Duchesne we will continue to grow and build on our Catholic traditions at Duchesne.

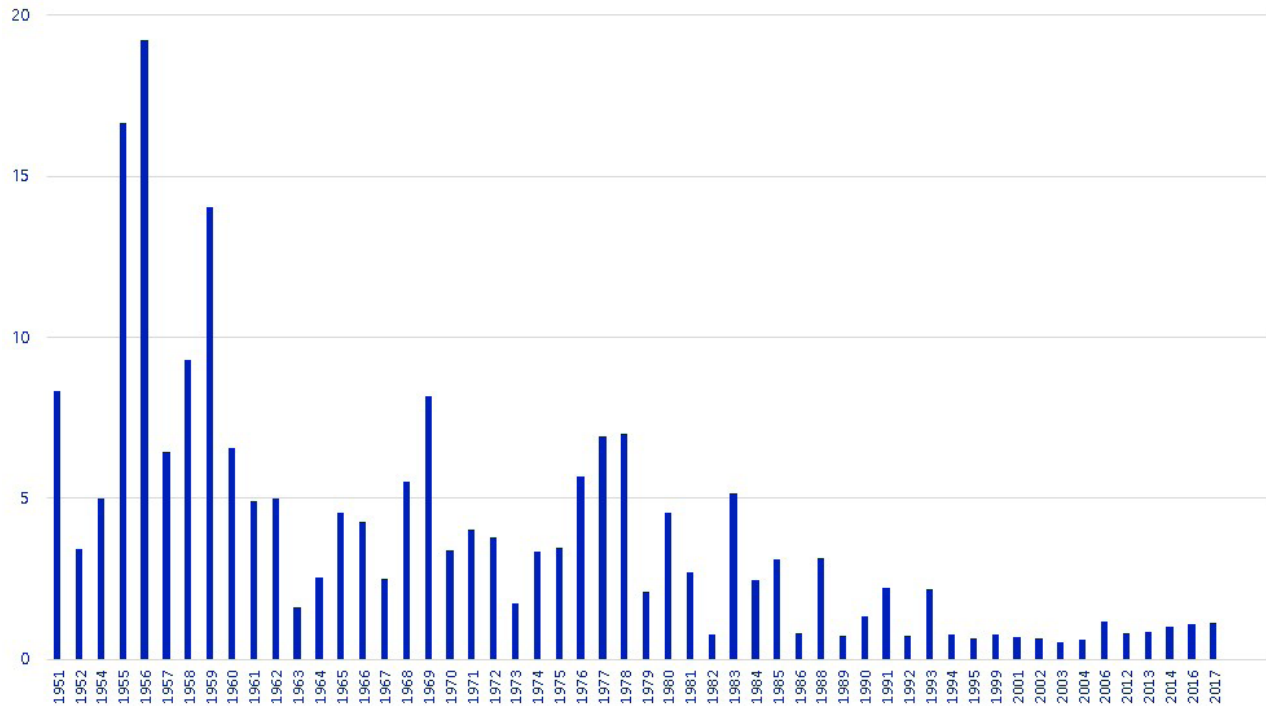

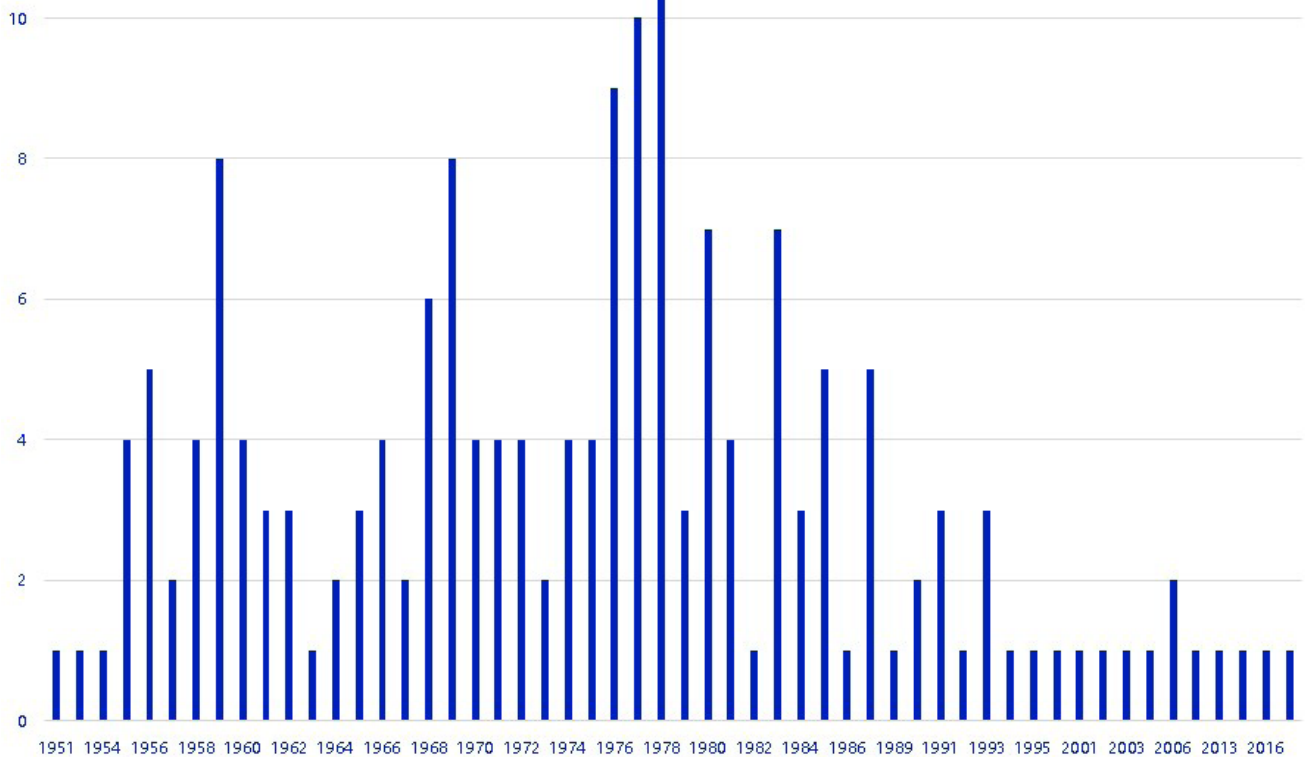

Two alumnae making a difference

Two Duchesne alumnae are collaborating to expand the services of a local charity.

Beginning in April, Denise (Westhues) Loewenstein '83 partnered with Gwendolyn's Gifts CEO Erin (Walker) Kramer '04 to develop a way to further support families who have lost a child due to lengthy illness.

The effort is part of a community ambassador program run by Loewen-

ening medical conditions. It was inspired by their oldest daughter, Gwendolyn, who courageously fought a progressive neurological condition for eight years before passing away on May 12, 2023. To date, the charity has donated over \$450,000 and assisted over 1,500 local families.

One of Cigna's guiding forces is philanthropy, and this year, Loewenstein's project will align with its focus on adolescent health resources. The ambassadorship will build on a current program that offers \$5,000 in funeral assistance to families during the most difficult time in their lives. However, there is more here than just a monetary contribution.

stein's employer, Cigna Healthcare. Every year, Cigna employees can apply for a \$20,000 contribution to be used in partnership with a charitable organization to support a specific project or need.

Gwendolyn's Gifts seemed like the natural choice to Denise.

"Gwendolyn's Gifts has always been at the center of my heart," she said. "When I approached Erin and explained

the premise of the project, she was really excited."

Founded in 2019, Gwendolyn's Gifts was created by Mark and Erin Kramer to help St. Louis families with children fighting life-threat-

"I was blown away," said Kramer. "It's generosity in two forms: Cigna provides a \$20,000 grant for us to complete the project, but then secondly, they allow the employees a three-month sabbatical to come work for

the charity, to be the project lead on it."

The new program, named Gwendolyn's Circle, will form partnerships with local funeral homes to provide reduced funeral costs to families in need, with the added goal of creating pre-packaged plans to assist grieving parents in the decision-making process following the death of a child. A resource guide containing lists of organizations that can help with other issues, such as mental healthcare for siblings, will also be produced.

In these ways, Loewenstein and Kramer hope to take some of the leg work out of the planning that follows the loss of a child, as well as assist parents who have lost their children in ways other than illness.

"This is a project I've wanted to do for a long time, but I didn't have the manpower to take it on," said Kramer. "I'm

just super excited to bring this project to life."

To date, six funeral homes have signed up to partner with Gwendolyn's Gifts. A marketing group has been hired to create the resource guide and provide web updates. A promotional video will also be produced.

Loewenstein plans to continue to volunteer her time and spearhead Gwendolyn's Circle past the end of the ambassadorship.

"This will be a great springboard for awareness," said Loewenstein. "A ton of people have read about her charity and are excited to help and continue to make it work past the three-month timespan."

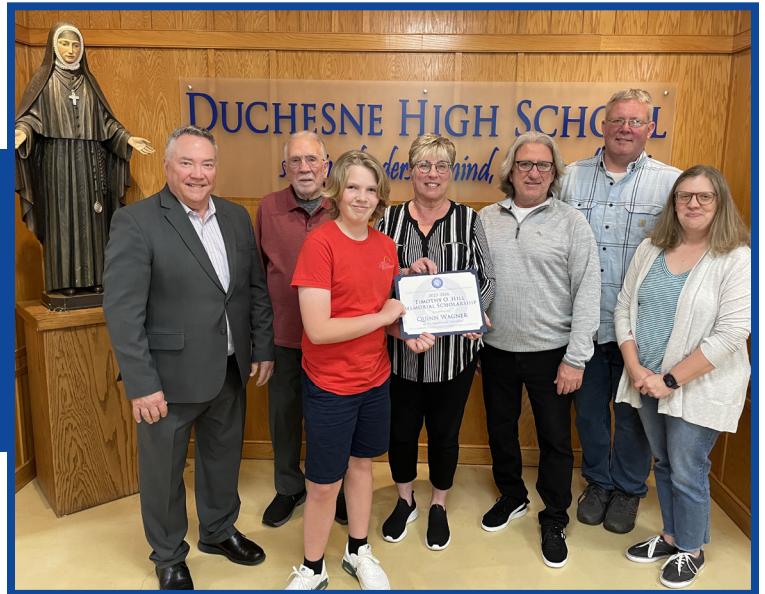
