On Thursday, April 24, Pioneer Nation and our guests from St. Dominic High School rallied around one of our own with support for alum Nathan Spiess '12 and his family during SpiessStrong Night at our Girls Varsity soccer game. Nathan was seriously injured on the job as a St. Louis City Police Officer on March 17.

The evening started with a BBQ tailgate in

the Grove area in front of the school. Food and drink were provided for a donation. One of the volunteers reported that nearly every person at the BBQ contributed \$20, with several people giving considerably more. Raffle tickets were also on sale for 10 different baskets or boards, which included tickets to St. Louis City Soc-

cer and St. Louis Cardinals Baseball (both donated by members of the St. Dominic community) as well as gift cards, lottery tickets, and more.

Prior to the 6:00 game vs. the Crusaders in Frank Barro Stadium, the St. Charles Police Department's Color Guard provided a presentation of our country's colors. Metro Air Police followed that with a helicopter flyover.

In addition to the continuing raffle basket sales during the first half, DHS volunteers also sold tickets for a halftime Chuck-a-Duck contest. All told, \$5,000 was raised in support of Nathan's Go-FundMe for his continued recovery and rehabilitation.

Construction on the updated locker rooms will begin on May 5 and they will not be back in use until August.







## Bringing Bronze to Life Bill Schnarre '68

When visiting St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church, you may have noticed a large bronze bust of the parish's patron saint as you enter Mass. Similarly, down at the St. Charles riverfront near the Lewis and Clark statue, four other bronze sculptures of notable members of that famous expedition are also on display. You may not know that self-taught artist and Duchesne alum Bill Schnarre '68 created and donated these pieces.

Schnarre has always dabbled in art, doing a little oil painting here and there, but he didn't consider himself an artist during his Duchesne days. After retiring from the construction business 15 years ago, he began to pursue sculpture more seriously with wood carvings. As time passed, he desired to explore a new medium: bronze.

"I was always interested in bronze work," said Schnarre. And so, he bought a few books and began to study.

Schnarre started with smaller sculptures and perfected his process by trial and error. Only six years later, there are at least five public pieces of his in St. Charles.

Schnarre's first bust was St. Charles Borromeo, which he

donated to his parish in 2021. Following that, he did a bust of John Colter and one of Pierre Cruzatte, both Lewis and Clark expedition members, that he donated to the parks department. The parks department was so impressed that they commissioned two more busts to go along with it under the Lewis and Clark statue in Frontier Park.

"If I can enhance the city a little bit, I'm more than happy to do that. Especially the parks department," he said.

Bronze casting is a multistage procedure, part artistic and part technical. The first step, which comes the most naturally to Schnarre, is creating a clay model of the subject from scratch, which serves as the basis for the whole work. From there, a series of molds are made of wax and ceramic. Molten bronze is poured in at a foundry, and after a day of cooling, metal grinders file away imperfections, and a patina is applied. The result is a bust of around 120 to 130 pounds that took six months to create from conception to finish.

One of Schnarre's favorite pieces is his rendering of Pierre Cruzatte. This natural-born river man is best known for having one eye and playing music for his fellow adventurers. His bust is depicted playing a fiddle.

Schnarre currently has several more projects in the works, including a bust of Louis Blanchette and a Respect Life piece, both of which he hopes to see in St. Charles.

Since retirement, Schnarre remarked that he loves to be active and productive, and creating art in bronze has been very rewarding. His story is an example of where curiosity and a desire to learn can take you, resulting in something truly beautiful that all can enjoy.

Campus Ministry has two final blessings to share with everyone. At our all school




