


New locker rooms are looking good!







Up, up and away.

No, that was not Superman flying in the air. It was Duchesne senior Oliver Rothweiler

He may not leap over tall buildings, but he did clear 15 feet, 6.5 inches to capture the Class 2 pole vault championship in the recent state meet at Atkins Stadium in Jefferson City.

That earned him the school record, which he set himself earlier in the season.

"It felt really good to win state," Rothweiler said. "It felt good being up there on top of the podium."

It was an accomplishment something Rothweiler worked hard to achieve, said Duchesne pole vault coach Paul Pilla.

He said Rothweiler has all the tools necessary to excel.

"He has excellent speed. Good strength.

Good body awareness. Good athleticism," Pilla said. "He's got a great amount of determination. He puts his head down and gets it done."

Rothweiler attempted to beat the state record in Class 2, which was set at 16-4 in 2006. Rothweiler was not successful in his attempts.

Rothweiler's accomplishments are made more impressive by the fact he did not come out for track until his junior year. As a freshman, he ran cross country, played football and tennis. He remained in cross country and tennis as a sophomore. Last spring, he joined the track team and continued to play tennis.

"I wanted to do track, but I never decided to do it until my junior year," Rothweiler said. "Tennis was in the way. I was good at tennis. I decided to pole vault because it looked like fun. I walked up to Paul and said, 'Can I pole vault?' He said, 'sure.' It went from there.

"I started at spring break in my junior year. It was just three days before my first meet." Pilla coached Rothweiler's sister, Elizabeth. She was pole vaulting as a senior when Rothweiler started his freshman year.

Pilla has been coaching the event for nine years. He competed in the event in high school and in college for two years at Arkansas State, where he is in the Hall of Fame.

In 1979, Pilla won the outdoor pole vault national championship with a vault of 17-4.25. Pilla was a two-time All-American on the outdoor circuit

So, he knows the sport.

"Some people get it more quickly than others. Oliver got it quick," Pilla said.

Rothweiler was honest in his assessment of himself when he began.

"I wasn't very good. I probably got 6 feet on the first day," Rothweiler said. But encouragement from Pilla kept him going.

Rothweiler earned a berth to the state tournament last spring. He finished seventh in the pole vault.

"I was lucky to get there. I got fourth in the district and seventh in the sectional," Rothweiler said. "Then I beat everybody from my sectional at state. I just wanted to get eighth place and get on the podium. I just wanted a medal. And I got seventh, which was on the podium."

Pilla was impressed with Rothweiler's first state appearance.

"His opening height was 12-6," Pilla said. "His personal record was 12 feet. And he did it. I was not expecting that. I was hoping for it. I was stunned. In your first year, you may be able to vault 10 feet. He went 12-6. I was flabbergasted he got that high."

For his senior season, Rothweiler set his sights high.

"He told me his expectations. He wanted to win state," Pilla said. "I told him, 'We'll go for it.' He did phenomenal. He worked hard." WHAT'S NEW 5

Rothweiler began working hard beginning last October. He trained at Pole Vault STL in O'Fallon.

From running to lifting weights, Rothweiler trained diligently. He likes how everyone just wants to get better in the event.

"The pole vault community is good. Everybody encourages everybody," Rothweiler said. "In football, you trash-talk your opponents. There's no trash talk in pole vault. You just try and get as high as you can."

For Rothweiler, the height he was aiming for was the Duchesne school record. It was 14-9. He was at 12-3.75, so he had to improve quite a bit.

"I thought it was a little bit out of reach, but I wanted to try," Rothweiler said.

The second meet of the season was held at St. Dominic. It featured four Catholic school teams.

That was the day Rothweiler earned the school record.

"It was pouring down rain. They let me jump one last time," Rothweiler said. "I got the school (record). I cleared 14-10. I couldn't jump anymore because of the rain. I was so happy."

In the season's last meet at MICDS, Rothweiler just cleared 15 feet.

He went on to win the District 2 meet at Lutheran North with a height of 15.3 feet.

"That was my second time clearing 15 feet," Rothweiler said. "I was really happy. I set up for 15-6 but I broke the pole. I always wanted to break a pole. I jumped and it broke, and I did a back flip and landed on the mat."

Rothweiler followed his district win by winning the Sectional 1 meet at Grandview High with a height of 14.93 feet.

"I was jumping really good that day," Rothweiler said.

South Callaway senior Colten Crocker, the top-ranked vaulter in Class 2, was the favorite to win the state meet. Crocker

won state in 2024 as a junior. His winning height was 13-07.25.

"I came into state as the underdog," Rothweiler said. "Crocker was the man to beat. I talked to him at the state meet last year. I knew it was going to be close. I came into state knowing I have to finish every jump.

"I focused on just jumping as high as I could. I can't control his jumps, so I just concentrated on my jumps."

Rothweiler was not overconfident.

"(Sprints coach Ben Smith) told me that you have to stay humble because if you get up on a high horse you'll expect to win and someone will come from behind you and overtake you," Rothweiler said. "Always put your best effort out there. If you don't give your best, someone else will beat you.

"I was going to give it my best shot."

Athletes choose their staring heights for the competition, which they have three attempts to clear. If a height is cleared, the vaulter advances to the next height, where they will have three more attempts. Once the vaulter has three consecutive misses, they are out of the competition and the highest height they cleared is their result.

Rothweiler and Crocker had a duel that will long be remembered.

Rothweiler started at 13 feet and then advanced to 13-6.

Crocker came in at 14 feet, which Rothweiler matched. Rothweiler skipped to 14-6. Crocker skipped to 15. Then Rothweiler went to 15, 15-3, 15-4 and 15-6.

Both then attempted 15 feet, 6.5 inches.

"I jumped and missed. He missed. I cleared it and he missed and then he missed the third time," Rothweiler said. "I was so excited."

So was Pilla.

"He got off the pit and he said it wasn't his best hump," Pilla said. "And looking at the video, it wasn't. His left leg was bent. He took off flatter than he should have, but he made it easy.

"He's not an emotional guy. He smiled and we slapped hands and we hugged. It was a good moment."


Rothweiler would attempt 16-4, a centimeter ahead of the Class 2 meet record of 16.31 but would fail on all three. Crocker, the 2024 champion in the event and topranked vaulter in Class 2, would settle for second at 15-3.75.

"It was thrilling and exciting to watch," Pilla said. "I told Colten's coach, 'This is the way it should be at state."

Rothweiler will be going to St. Charles Community College for the next two years. He plans to continue with Pole Vault STL and stay in shape.


"That's the goal, maybe go to college after that and compete," Rothweiler said. "I couldn't have done any of this without coach Pilla. He's the main reason I got there to state and Pole Vault SLT and their coaches Chris Zoeller, Kurt Bliggenstorfer and Mayson DeRousse. They all have been great to me."



A World Cup Win in Germany

One Duchesne alum's hard work has led him across the world to Garmisch, Germany, to secure the championship in the 2025 Master's Inline Hockey World Cup.

Rhys Boschert '96 is no stranger to success in the world of inline hockey. During the 2022 Memorial Day Weekend, Boschert participated in setting a new record for the longest inline hockey marathon at Midwest Sport Hockey in Ballwin, MO. The world record attempt was a part of a fundraiser for Make-A-Wish Missouri & Kansas to help provide wishes to local critically-ill children. The event raised \$62,410.

Since then, Boschert has played in the Veterans Division (45+) for the Inline Hockey World Cup, taking home the silver in 2023 and 2024. This year, his team secured the first-ever gold medal for their division.

"I was confident we had a good team, but you are never sure that you are going to win," said Boschert.
"Sweden, France, and Canada all had very good teams too,

and I think any of the four of us could have won the whole thing."

Team USA achieved an impressive run of success, falling only to Sweden in game three.

After a narrow win against Canada in the semi-final, they took the gold during a rematch with Sweden with an overtime victory of 2-1.

"Sweden had two new guys this year that were huge additions to their team, but as a whole, we were a better team, in my opinion," said Boschert.

Boschert finished 2nd on the team in scoring for the tournament with 11 points in seven games: four goals and seven assists.

Two other USA divisions also achieved victory this year; taking the gold in Womens (35+) and Mens Masters (38+).

Boschert had plenty of family who came along to cheer him on this journey.

"Watching Rhys and Team USA win was absolutely unforgettable," said Boschert's wife, Stacy. "The final game was a nail-biter; everyone was on the edge of their seats until that game-winning goal. I'm so grateful I got to be there to see it all unfold, and even more thankful that Rhys' mom, dad, and sisters (Jesand Roberta) were there to





- 1. Open the email invitation you received from Healthy Roster. You may download the app from the email or click on the link to sign up via the website. Please note the 6-character access code in the email, as this will be needed to verify your account.
- 2. Upon clicking the link or downloading the app, you will enter the access code where indicated.
- 3. After validating your access code, you will be asked to choose whether you need to create a new account with Healthy Roster or if you already have an account. Click on the appropriate option.
- 4. Once you have created or logged into your account you should now have access to all your student athletes. If you are missing any athletes that you are responsible for, please contact your athletic trainer.
- 5. Double check all demographic information on your athlete's account. Make sure the information that is already entered is correct and add any missing information.
- 6. Please select Manage Teams for your athlete and add the athlete to the teams they want to be a part of. This can be adjusted later.


















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
