

Humility chosen as theme for 2022-23

This fall, Duchesne began a new tradition of choosing a Catholic virtue that will serve as the theme for the school year.

Duchesne principal Dominic D'Urso '95 said the program will help unite and strengthen the school community, as well as inspire its students.

"I was also looking for a way to encourage students, particularly seniors, to take ownership of the school," D'Urso said. "To accomplish these goals, I settled on the Catholic virtues."

The seniors will discuss the virtues each year during their annual retreat. This year, they chose humility as their theme.

The chosen virtue will serve as

the focus for all-school Masses and be made visible throughout the school on posters featuring quotes from the saints. Students who model how to live out the virtue in their daily lives will be celebrated.

The program will also help continue Duchesne's objective to catechize its students and develop their faith lives.

"The goal for our virtue training is to focus on learning how to be good, as opposed to just avoiding doing/being bad," said D'Urso.

Students hold bake sale to benefit local charities

Two Duchesne students are using their baking talents to raise money for St. Louis charities.

Juniors Julia Winkeler and Katie Hill began holding bake sales for their fellow students in the halls of Duchesne last year as part of an assignment for STEM class. STEM is an auxiliary class in Duchesne's Scholars Academy curriculum.

"One of our assignments was to do a mini-capstone project to benefit the community," explained Winkeler. "Katie and I partnered up and came up with the idea to do a bake sale. "

Their first bake sale was held in December of 2021 and raised \$454 for the St. Louis chapter of the Make-a-Wish Foundation. In February, another bake sale raised \$360 for the Wings Program, which helps pay hospice bills for pediatric patients.

The duo continued their work into this school year with a sale benefiting Kids Rock Cancer, an organization that uses music to help pediatric patients cope with their cancer diagnosis. For three days, students could choose from a variety of tasty treats for purchase and

help support a good cause.

"We feel very strongly about helping pediatric patients because we both have personal experiences with our family members having childhood diseases," said Winkeler. Winkeler and Hill's next bake sale will be on December 4 at the Pioneer Christmas event and during lunch on December 5 and 6. The proceeds will be donated to the St. Louis Chapter of the Make-a-Wish Foundation.

Duchesne teacher plans class trip to London and Paris in 2024

Duchesne High School is excited to announce that its students will have the opportunity to participate in a class trip to London and Paris in June of 2024.

The journey will feature 11 days of traveling and touring London and Paris, exploring the deep history and culture at sites such as the Tower of London, Canterbury Cathedral, the Louvre, and the D-Day beaches of Normandy. Students will also get the chance to watch a show at the Globe Theatre.

The tour is being organized by Kim Morris, 1989 Duchesne alumna and literature teacher, and facilitated by EF Educational Tours.

Morris began putting details together for the tour with Duchesne administration this spring, and her enthusiasm for the project continued to grow after her own trip to London over the summer, where she visited some of the oldest buildings in England.

"I learned a lot on the trip," she explained. "I just kept thinking about how I want to share this with my students."

Duchesne principal Dominic D'Urso said trips like these can be life-changing.

"Traveling abroad can be a wonderful experience," he said. "[It] can open up the world for our students."

Duchesne Athletic Boosters president Jason Boschert is the father of one of the students considering going on the tour and recognizes the

unique academic enrichment that global travel offers.

"This is an incredible opportunity to see the world!" he said. "I am very excited for my son to expand his education outside the classroom."

An informational meeting was held Thursday evening, September 22, with about 90 people in attendance to listen to the presentation.

Morris explained that she is happy to see class trips return to Duchesne. She went to Paris for two weeks as a high school junior and hopes this trip will leave a similar impact on her students.

"I still remember that trip," she

said. "It's just something they'll always remember."

AP EXAM REGISTRATION!

Parents should be aware that October 20 & 21 are the registration days for AP (Advanced Placement) exams. The teachers of AP classes are a great source of information about the exams that require \$97 for each exam payable by check to DHS. (Multiple exams are payable by a single check.) Mr. Tinsley will collect the exam fees on the dates indicated and administer the exams at DHS in May.


