Duchesne locker rooms get huge update

After decades of use, Duchesne's locker rooms received a significant renovation, transforming into spaces that will be far more functional and comfortable for student athletes for years to come.

The Duchesne administration conceived of the new endeavor after last year's student fitness center update. They decided the time was right to move forward with the project after the school raised over \$348k during the 2024 #iGiveCatholic campaign.

"We are so appreciative of the wonderful donors who provided the funds for this project through our #iGiveCatholic Giving Day," said Duchesne President Paul Boschert '77. "We now have great dressing room



facilities for our athletic teams and physical education classes that are the best in the area."

The locker rooms feature epoxy floors, updated lighting, updated plumbing, and, of course, new lockers.

All five locker rooms re-

ceived improvements, four built in 1990. The fifth, commonly known as "The Dungeon" by DHS athletic staff, dates back to the 1950s and shows the most drastic change.

Duchesne Athletic Director Renee Moore '86 said

the new space will help create a strong team-bonding atmosphere.

"Not a single detail was left out," she said. "The locker rooms truly reflect our commitment to excellence. A heartfelt thank you to everyone who helped make these spaces a reality."

"We are so excited to have this new space for the athletes," said Boys and Girls Head Volleyball Coach Maddie Krause '20. "This will be an amazing new addition to our team culture and leave the athletes with a sense of pride to be able to compete together."







Duchesne Charts Bold Path Forward:

Enrollment Growth, Strong Support, and Clear Goals

"What does Duchesne need?"

It's a question alumni, parents, and community members have asked for years. The Duchesne Board of Directors has a clear and confident answer: continued enrollment growth, sustained financial support, and the active engagement of our entire Pioneer Nation. But there is so much more...

President Paul Boschert '77 and Director of Advancement Becky Williamson continue to share updates on where the school stands with the progress already made, and what will be required over the next several years to ensure Duchesne's long-term success. The message is equal parts celebration of recent wins and a call to action for everyone who cares about the future of the school.

Enrollment Momentum: Turning the Tide

In the early 2020s during Covid, Duchesne faced a daunting challenge: lower than normal freshman classes, which in turn led to smaller upper-class numbers for the subsequent years. This was an unsustainable enrollment level for a school with the kind of academic, extracurricular, and faith-based mission Duchesne champions.

But the tide has turned!

In the 2024–2025 school year, Duchesne welcomed a freshman class number that showed a **29% increase** over the previous year — a significant jump from 2023-2024. This fall, the incoming freshman

class showed a 39% increase year over year, the strongest freshmen enrollment in over 10 years. It's evidence that the school's renewed outreach efforts are paying off.

We've reversed an unsustainable trend. That's no small feat. And it's just the beginning.

The growth is no accident! Duchesne's admissions team has expanded its reach to more than 60 private and public grade schools, strengthening relationships with feeder schools and introducing more young families to the Pioneer experience. The school has also been tracking engagement from 6th-8th graders who visit campus or participate in three or more activities — the increases in attendance for these events is a key predictor of continued future enrollment increases.

Based on these efforts, the Board projects the 2026–2027 freshman class will again exceed previous Freshmen enrollment.

Financial Achievements: A Strong Foundation

The past two years have brought more than just enrollment growth — they've also seen a remarkable wave of financial support from alumni and friends of Duchesne.

Since 2023, donor generosity has totaled more than \$2.6 million. Of that, \$1.5 million has been invested directly into facility and program improvements — visible upgrades that enhance the student experience. Another \$1 million has

supported the school's annual operating budget, helping ensure academic excellence, extracurricular opportunities, and mission-centered education.

These investments have touched every corner of the campus. From classrooms to student programs, the results are impressive and energizing.

I want to emphasize that these upgrades are not just cosmetic — they are part of a larger strategy to position Duchesne for sustained growth and success.

How We Get There: Expanding the Circle

Today, much of Duchesne's annual fundraising comes from a loyal group of dedicated alumni and friends who give year after year. While their continued support is essential, the Board is clear that the future depends on widening that circle.

Last year saw meaningful contributions from both long-time supporters and new or re-engaged donors. The challenge now is to accelerate that growth — increasing both the number of participants and the total dollars contributed.

Participation rates vary by graduating class, and those numbers are shared regularly in newsletters. The Board plans to highlight them again in upcoming communications, underscoring that every gift — regardless of size — moves the school closer to its goals.

A Stronger Partnership with the Archdiocese

The Board also addressed a topic that has been on many minds: the school's relationship with the Archdiocese following the "All Things New" process. In recent years, the initiative has caused understandable concern and uncertainty among Duchesne families and supporters.

Today, the reality is very different. The Archdiocese is fully invested in Duchesne's future, providing not only financial guidance and support but more importantly, ongoing positive engagement as our school works our strategic planning process for long-term sustainability and growth.

Recently Julie Scott Soffner, President of Catholic Education for the Archdiocese of St. Louis, stated to the Board,

"The future of Duchesne High School looks incredibly bright. Duchesne's reputation remains strong when considering key metrics: the school's commitment to Catholic identity and mission-delivery, overall school growth, increased annual giving and fundraising efforts, facility enhancements, and the structure and competency of the new Governing Board. Increased levels of engagement from passionate Duchesne supporters is equally impressive. We are proud to watch Pioneer Nation grow under its new leadership and governance structure. Together, we continue to nurture a Christ-centered, academically excellent institution while focusing on sustainability for generations of future Duchesne High School families."

The Road Ahead: A Call to the Pioneer Nation

For Duchesne, the message is clear and forward-looking. Enrollment is climbing, facilities are improving, and community support is strong. But sustaining that trajectory will require continued commitment — from current donors, from alumni who have not given in recent years, and from new supporters inspired by the school's mission.

The answer to "What does Duchesne need?" is simple. We need continued support from those already giving, an increase in participation from alumni, parents, and friends who may not have given recently, and the shared energy of a united Pioneer Nation to go out and tell our story of success and growth.

The coming years offer the chance to solidify Duchesne's position as a thriving, mission-driven school that prepares students for success in life and leadership. The Board is confident that, with the continued dedication of alumni, parents, and friends, that vision will become reality and will thrive for another 100 years.

For now, we invite the community to engage, attend upcoming events, spread the word — and above all, to give generously. If you have not been to Duchesne in the last 12 months,

I invite you to come for a tour. You will be amazed at the transformation that has occurred.

The future is bright, but it's not a given. It's something we build together, step by step, gift by gift, student by student. Come back home to Pioneer Nation and help us continue the legacy of shaping leaders in Mind, Body, and Spirit!

The sky's the limit in business and in life

An attitude of never giving up. To "do right" in all of your relationships. These values were passed to Brian Klutenkamper '75 during his time at Duchesne, helping him become an experienced pilot, business owner, and a proud Pioneer Parent.

Brian started grade school at St. Joseph in Cottleville. His family briefly moved to Ohio, then returned to St. Charles, where he finished grade school at St. Peter School before attending Duchesne. From an early age, he had a keen interest in aviation, one he shared with his father.

"Dad wanted to be a pilot in the military," he said. "Due to vision issues, he ended up serving as an aircraft mechanic between World War II and the Korean War. He would always take us to airshows and pay for airplane rides."

Brian spent his years at Duchesne playing golf, football, and enjoying learning about chemistry and the other sciences. Today, aviation is a new addition to Duchene's curriculum, and if it had been available during his high school years, it would undoubtedly have been on his radar.

"I would have jumped on it," he said. "I'm really glad to see it will be a part of the curriculum this fall."

It was 1985 before he would revisit his interest in flying. He took flying lessons and bought his first plane that December. The skill proved to be quite valuable. He began

working for Engineered Lubricants in 1982 in a role where travel was crucial. His ability to fly would prove to be a key tool at his disposal from then on out.

"You could do what would take you two to three weeks in three or four days. It really helped me grow the business much faster than I could have any other way," he said.

Forty-three years later, Brian is an owner at the same company, his children are all Duchesne graduates, and he is still a very active pilot. In fact, he's one of five pilots in his graduating class.
