

New classroom tech takes learning to the 3rd dimension

Duchesne students now have access to a new high-tech tool for their anatomy and biology classes. The Anatomage Table features multiple life-size real human bodies (donated to science) in a digital format displaying 3-D representations and simulations for anatomy, physiology, and pathology.

The Anatomage Table is an advanced real-human-based medical education platform that serves medical schools, undergraduate healthcare industries, and K-12 education. The table seeks to augment programs to help prepare high school students for healthcare careers.

The 3D table can be used flat or standing up and display

thousands of annotated structures that students can select from a cadaver or list, then isolate and study. "There are also hundreds of real patient case studies with different filters to change the anatomical sharpness," said Duchesne anatomy teacher Glennis Ziegler. "I have the ability to make quizzes/lab practicums using the cadaver models that can be saved, transferred to be printed, or can be taken on the table itself."

Students can also hone dissection, ultrasound imaging, and endoscopy skills, to name a few. Structures can be color-coded for quick and easy identification, and healthy and pathological tissues can be compared and displayed for exploration.

"I just know the table is awesome, and I'm feeling a little overwhelmed by all it can actually do," said Ziegler. "I have already incorporated it into my anatomy classes and can't wait to do more."







New Scholarships from Duchesne Alumni, Parents, and Friends!

With the amazing momentum Duchesne has going, we are seeing increased support in addition to increased awareness of and excitement for our wonderful school! A number of people have offered new scholarships to help more students benefit from our exceptional education experience provided in a warm and safe family environment where we are shaping leaders in mind, body, and spirit.



In the same spirit, the Jacqueline Hummel & James Edler Scholarship and the Joseph & Florence Kalal and Jean Morrissey Scholarship have been established. The Hummel/Edler scholarship will provide four years of \$5,000/ year in tuition assistance for a single



Memories of a favorite teacher

A lifelong Pioneer: Terry Gravemann'68

erry Gravemann has been known by several nicknames during his 60-plus years as a Pioneer: Mr. G., Mr. Duchesne, and even Gravy. From student to president, he touched many lives along the way, and according to all who know him, he bleeds blue like no other.

A lifelong Saint Charles resident, Mr. Gravemann graduated from Duchesne in 1968. He finished his teaching degree in 1972. In 1973, the then head of school, Father John Hickel, invited him to apply at Duchesne one day after Mass at St. Charles Borremeo.

Mr. Gravemann always felt that he would love to end up at Duchesne to teach.

"When I got hired, I felt like I was coming home," he said. The class of 1977 was the first class he had for all four years. "A couple of them



are on the board right now," he added with a smile.

"As a freshman in 1973, I was part of his first classes at Duchesne," said Rich Hollander '77. "Mr. G. was my teacher, key club moderator, mentor, and friend. He was even a part of my wedding

"Mr. Gravemann was one of my favorite teachers while attending Duchesne in the mid-70s," said Paul Boschert '77, current Duchesne president. "He has spent his entire life as a Pioneer in some capacity. In retirement, he continues to be involved in the Duchesne community, serving on the Duchesne trouble and were sent to his Board of Directors."

The first few years went by, and Mr. Gravemann taught World History and always strived to learn how to connect more with his students.

"I felt like I had a good relationship with the students," he said.

He saw each student as an individual. His mantra: You have to give respect to get respect.

In 1977, Head of School Father Robert Jovanovic asked him if he'd consider taking on an administrative role as dean of students.

"I was doing double duty," said Gravemann. "[I was] teaching three classes and doing the 'dean thing."

Russ Clever '87 remembers him as both a teacher and dean.

"He's Mr. Duchesne," said Clever. "If we ever got in office when he was the dean, we knew we would get a good laugh. He was always good for a joke."

humor," said Sara Chaney (Burkemper)'03. "I can remember one time at a pep rally he said over the microphone, 'I'm not a stand-up comedian, so I'll sit down!""

As time went on, Mr. Gravemann became the fulltime dean of students. Father Dale Wunderlich needed him in the full-time administration position as Duchesne geared up for a capital campaign for the new gym. He was happy to take on the new role, but it was hard to let go of being in the classroom.

"The further you get into admin, the further you get from day-to-day contact with the kids. We just didn't cross paths as often," he said.

Hearing from some of the students he had at this time, he still left an impression. Students approach him



DHS career-scoring record broken



On September 25, 2024, history was made in the Duchesne Soccer program. Senior Cole Brockmeyer '25 broke the career-scoring record previously held by Andy Pancio '01.

While researching the record, we had the great fortune of reconnecting with Andy. He held the career-scoring record for 24 years, and in those 24 years, Andy has accomplished much to make Pioneer Nation proud. After graduating from Duchesne, Andy went on to play collegiate soccer at Butler University. In those four years, Andy continued to display the same leadership skills, motivation, and competitive spirit he was known for when playing for the Pioneers. He received the Frank "Pop" Hedden award for top freshman student and went on to be named Horizon

League first-team academic all-conference each of his four years at Butler!


















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
