# Learning the importance of online safety

On November 11, marathon runner and online-safety speaker Ben Tracy gave an engaging talk to Duchesne students. Topics ranged from being aware of online predators to cyberbullying and included many examples from Tracy's own life.

The talk is a part of the Tracy Trek program, a 120-day run across the country. Less than 400 people have completed a coast-to-coast run. Through this and his talks, Ben hopes to raise awareness among students, parents, and lawmakers about the dangers that social media poses and possible solutions.

The event stems from Duchesne's current strategic planning process, specifically in the Student Life domain. Assistant Principal of Student Life Debi Turner is responsible for this particular goal, which is to evaluate student needs regarding mental health and life balance. With social media being the source of so many instances of mental illness among teens, Mrs. Turner thought Tracy's program would be perfect for Duchesne.

"Almost every disciplinary issue we see in the school stems from social media in some way, shape, or form," she said. "Every single one of them. It is everywhere, and it's not going away, so we need to be responsible and give our students the knowledge they need to be safe and smart."

Tracy recounted his own story of how an old Tweet containing an insensitive joke cost him an important job in the administration of the Illinois Governor's Office.

"[It] was eye-opening," said senior Hunter Dodson. "He made me realize how dangerous social media can be and how important it is to think before posting." Tracy gave a special presentation designed just for parents that evening.

"We had 88 people come to the parent portion of the presentation," said Mrs. Turner. "We opened it to our feeder schools, their families, and their faculty. We actually had families from Lutheran St. Charles, St. Dominic, and the St. Charles public schools attend, too."

Tracy's story impacted both students and parents alike, and it's clear to Mrs. Turner there is a real need for more talks like this.

"We have only scratched the surface of how to protect our community, but we are making a pledge to continue this effort!" she said.





# Navigating the college application process

A Capstone Project helps provide guidance for Duchesne seniors

A student's Capstone Project allowed Duchesne seniors to learn more about the college application process and the confidence they need to make one of the most significant decisions of their lives.

Senior Faith Dunn's College Application Day was held on November 12 in the Performing Arts Center, where advisors from colleges met with over 25 seniors to answer questions.

"My inspiration for my Capstone Project was how little knowledge my friends and I had about the college application process," said Faith. "Thinking about that, I figured I could maybe do some type of project that revolved around college readiness and confidence, especially in seniors stressed out and anxious about applying."

Colleges in attendance included Missouri S&T, McKendree College, Maryville University, St. Charles Community College, and more.

"Faith wanted to do something related to college planning for her senior class," said

Brittany Grass '08, college and career counselor and Faith's mentor on the project. "She was a joy to work with and created an event that I hope to utilize with future classes." Faith hopes the experience gave her fellow students more certainty as they embark on this new chapter of their lives.

"They might have learned

how to do something they didn't know before or gain useful knowledge on a new thing they can walk away with and use again," she said.

#iGiveCatholic Giving Tuesday campaign.

### **Review Your Enrollment**

Review current academic year enrollment *for qualifying students.* 

- Elementary schools: focus on income-eligible kindergarten and 1st grade classes and transfer students -or- qualifying special needs students (IEP/ISP).
- High Schools: focus on income eligible transfers from public schools (9-12) -or- special needs students (IEP/ISP).

### Develop Guidance for Tuition Payment


Scholarship funds from this program are directly administered to *families*. Schools should consider developing guidance for families as it pertains to accepting MOScholars scholarship payment to cover tuition/registration fees.

### What is MOScholars?

\$6,375 renewable scholarships for eligible K-12 students.

### Who is eligible for MOScholars?

All Missouri residentes.

- Students with an established IEP or ISP -OR-
  - Income eligible and Transferring from a public/charter school -or-Entering Kindergarten or first grade.

### How do students apply?

- TTEF offers a prescreening application available at ttef-stl.org/moscholars. When a student "qualifies" they are automatically directed to the online application administered by FACTS.
- Upon approval from FACTS, TTEF will inform the families and school of choice of their award.
- Families may begin applying for the 2025 2026 academic year as of February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025.


### How will my school be paid?

- MOScholars is awarded via ClassWallet to the student for approved educational expenses.
- TTEF encourages families to pay school tuition and fees with MOScholars awards.
- Schools will create a ClassWallet account to receive direct payments for tuition from MOScholars families.


# Should families continue to apply for other TTEF scholarships?

- Yes. Families should continue to apply for all TTEF's scholarships (both new and renewal).
- Should TTEF award a student and the same student earns a MOScholars award, TTEF will remove the TTEF scholarship.
- Siblings of MOScholars may continue on a TTEF award.

# 1950 St. Louis and St. Charles Trains in Fred Wilke's basement

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Model trains arrived under my Christmas tree in 1948 and they have been my hobby for 77 years. I had a lapse while attending Duchesne and College in the 60s, but started new in the early 70s. While attending an Army


Logistics class at Fort Lee Virginia, I lived with my new wife in a basement with no TV, radio, phone, or activity. My wife had one record that played Camelot over and over. I abandoned the music and found a hobby shop buying an engine and some cars.

Returning to St. Louis, my duty station was in the Federal Building in downtown St. Louis overlooking the train yard. The idea of building a Union Station and the yards around them got stronger every day. The train shed would be the centerpiece and I hoped to reach St. Charles as the railroad expanded over the last 20 years. I selected 1950 as era since I could run Steam and Diesel engines. The fact that in 1950, Union Station had over 100 passenger trains departing each day, further determined the era I would model.

The railroad expanded to the present size of 30 by 50 feet. I have added many St. Louis building but also created the towns of Ferguson, Webster, Kirkwood, Pacific, St. Charles, Wentzville, and Kansas City. Finding the historical use of building in each town adds to the enjoyment and accuracy. I especially enjoyed building St. Charles. I have the old St. Charles Rock Road bridge which leads you past ACF. As you go up the Missouri river along the KATY trail (previously KATY Railroad), you see 1 st, 2 nd, and 3 rd Street buildings. High on the bluff is the county seat and some of the old St. Charles houses.

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Yearly, we have an open house on the first Sunday of December. The theme is the Polar Express and one of the trains is the Polar Express. Many of the 100 engines, passenger cars, and freight cars catch your eye. Hot chocolate and cookies are served in the dining car and the movie plays on the big screen TV. My wife Marilynn decorates 15 trees and every inch of the house. Adults are children again and children laugh and play.


