Lady Pioneers learn lessons in team building, responsibility, and life

A Duchesne teacher and girls basketball coach from the past returned to share her deep knowledge of the sport with the Lady Pioneers.

Girls Basketball Head Coach Jerel Taylor first reached out to Coach Marita Malone last year regarding a return to Duchesne to run a workshop on team building.

Coach Malone was the second girls basketball coach in Duchesne history, leading the girls from 1974 to 1983. She also taught English, coached track and field hockey, and assisted on the softball team.

"This is now becoming a yearly tradition," said Coach Taylor. "Her wealth of knowledge and experience is valuable; our girls learn a lot from her."

Coach Malone was happy to return to spend time with the Lady Pioneers, discussing team building, culture, and character on the court.

"It was an honor to be asked by Duchesne," said Coach Malone. "Through the years that I coached at Duchesne, I was blessed with phenomenal players. They

were willing to accept my coaching style: firm, intense, and driven to be better at the sport and as a person; the latter was more important because I taught that through sports, they would be able to handle life better or as I often say, "to handle hard better."

"I thought she was a very wise person," said senior and guard Madisyn McCarthy. "[She] taught us a few things about responsibility and teamwork, and what we needed to put

out on the court to be better for each other and ourselves to play."

Women's sports in coeducational schools began thanks to Title IX in 1973. This school year marks the 50th anniversary of Duchesne's girls basketball team.

"I felt like I was giving back to primarily all those women I had coached, and, secondly, to the long string of women who succeeded me, all those who were attempting to follow the footsteps of the original players," said Coach Malone. "Duchesne womens athletics has a long history of winners in the sport and life in general ... My hope is that I made a difference for them."

Information for Eligible Schools



WHAT SHOULD SCHOOLS DO NEXT?

Review Your Enrollment

Review current academic year enrollment *for qualifying students*.

- Elementary schools: focus on income-eligible kindergarten and 1st grade classes and transfer students -or- qualifying special needs students (IEP/ISP).
- High Schools: focus on income eligible transfers from public schools (9-12) -or- special needs students (IEP/ISP).

Develop Guidance for Tuition Payment

Scholarship funds from this program are directly administered to *families*. Schools should consider developing guidance for families as it pertains to accepting MOScholars scholarship payment to cover tuition/registration fees.

What is MOScholars?

\$6,375 renewable scholarships for eligible K-12 students.

Who is eligible for MOScholars?

All Missouri residents.

- Students with an established IEP or ISP **-OR-**
- Income eligible **and**
Transferring from a public/charter school **-or-**
Entering Kindergarten or first grade.

How do students apply?

- TTEF offers a prescreening application available at ttef-stl.org/moscholars. When a student "qualifies" they are automatically directed to the online application administered by FACTS.
- Upon approval from FACTS, TTEF will inform the families and school of choice of their award.
- Families may begin applying for the 2025 – 2026 academic year as of February 1st, 2025.

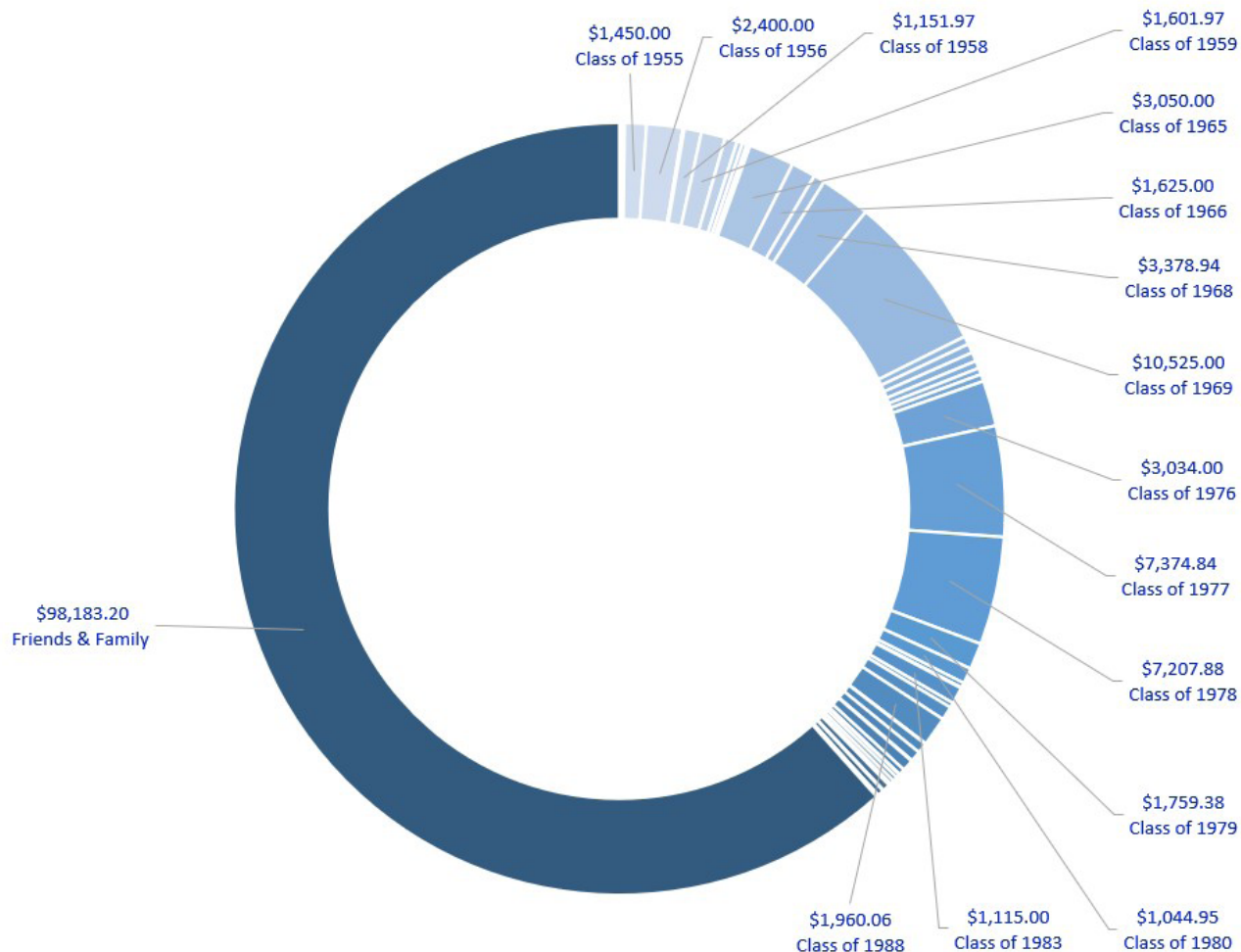
How will my school be paid?

- MOScholars is awarded via ClassWallet to the student for approved educational expenses.
- TTEF encourages families to pay school tuition and fees with MOScholars awards.
- Schools will create a ClassWallet account to receive direct payments for tuition from MOScholars families.

Should families continue to apply for other TTEF scholarships?

- Yes. Families should continue to apply for all TTEF's scholarships (both new and renewal).
- Should TTEF award a student and the same student earns a MOScholars award, TTEF will remove the TTEF scholarship.
- Siblings of MOScholars may continue on a TTEF award.

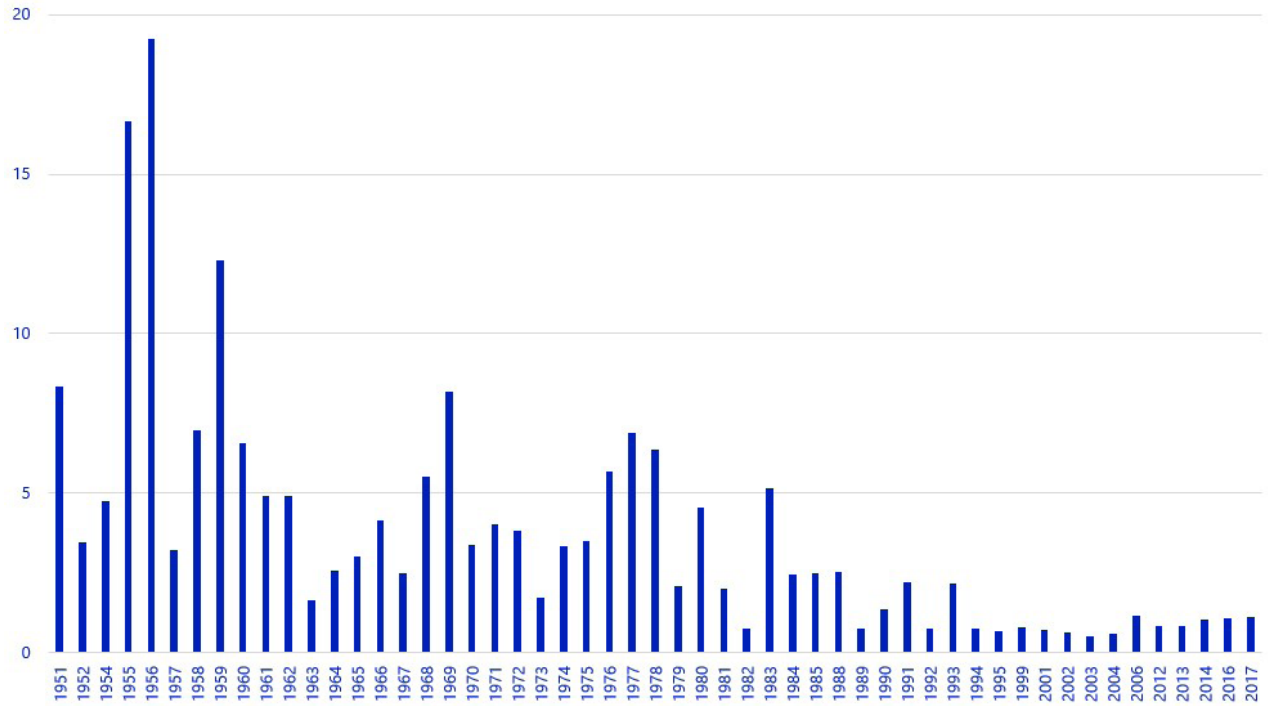

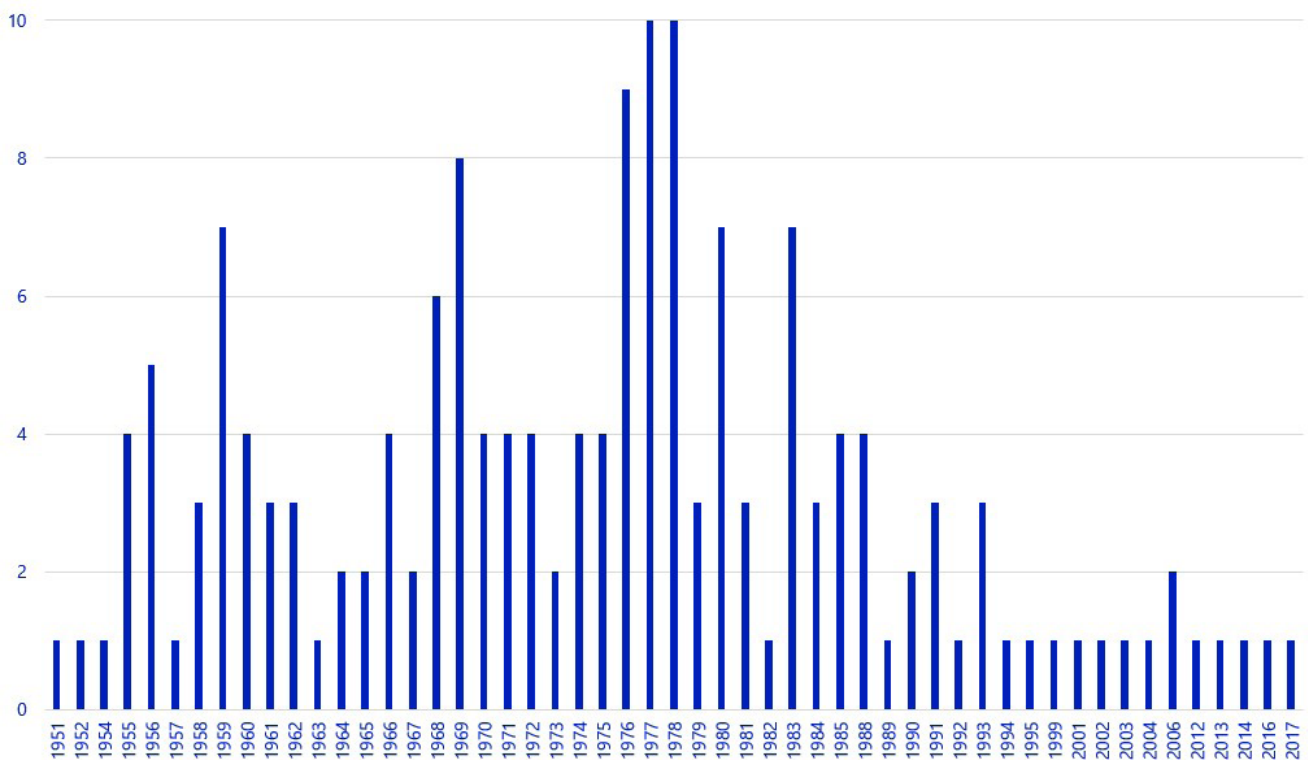

MHSBCA Coach of the Year

On Saturday, January 25, Duchesne Head Baseball Coach and alum Mike Hollander '09 was named Class 3 Coach of the Year by the 2024 Missouri High School Baseball Coaches Association (MHSBCA), and served as guest speaker for the evening.

The MHSBCA is one of the most substantial organizations of its kind in the country. It offers members opportunities for professional growth and networking with other coaches, and recognizes coaches and players for their achievements.

In the spring of 2024, Coach Hollander led Duchesne to victory in the Class 3 State Championship. This year will be his 7th season as varsity baseball coach.

"Coach Hollander is so deserving of the Class 3 Baseball Coach of the Year honor," said Duchesne Athletic Director Renee Moore '86. "He will humbly



tell you that it is the players that win championships, which is true, but someone has to give the players an opportunity to learn, grow, fail, and eventually succeed. Coach Hollander

is that someone. He is a coach who has spent time creating a program culture; he believes in his players and is invested in them on and off the playing field."

"It's a well-deserved honor," said pitcher Gavin Moffitt '25. "He's always been somebody who's laid back but always there to push us."

"He's a solid coach," said outfielder Luke Fink '25. "He deserves the recognition he's getting."

"This recognition is really a reflection of the incredible people who make our program what it is," said Coach Hollander. "It's always an honor to be acknowledged by your peers. But the truth is, this award belongs to our players, assistant coaches, school administration, and support staff more than it does to me."

Coach Hollander cites his players' dedication, work ethic, and faith in God as major contributing factors in last season's success, as well as the time and energy poured into the program by the assistant coaches.

"I am honored to be able to represent Duchesne and our team to accept this award on behalf of everyone who played a role in making our 2024 season one to remember," he said.

While at Duchesne as a student, Coach Hollander was named "Outstanding Male Athlete" for his football, basketball, and baseball accomplishments and was voted 1st Team All-Conference in football and baseball for the Gateway Athletic Conference.

"Duchesne is lucky to have Coach Hollander and his staff leading our baseball program!" said Moore.

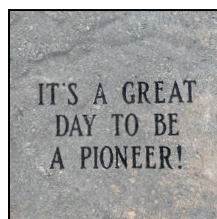

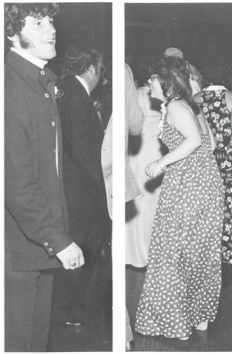

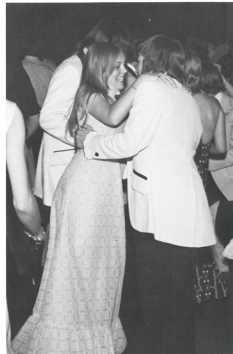
position, Terry is also a great advocate and spokesperson for Duchesne throughout our St. Charles County community.

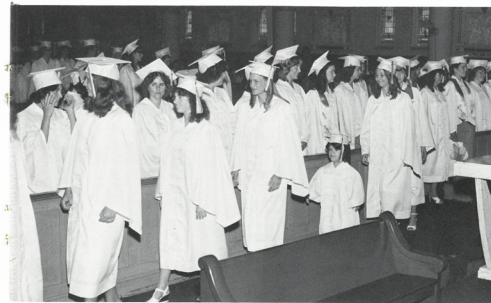

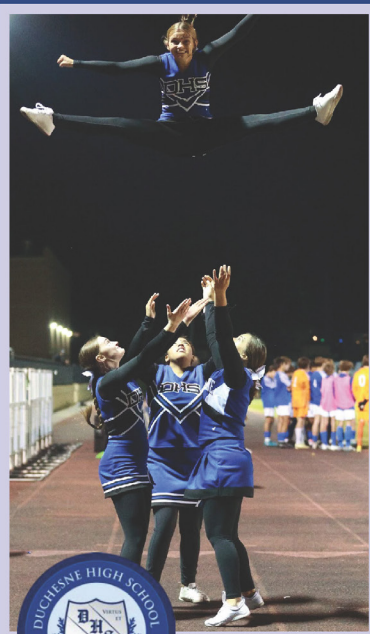
