1810-1820	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1812 October 1 St. Charles County was established and St. Charles became the County Seat. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1814 End of Napoleon's Empire • 1815 Brief return of Napoleon which ended with his defeat at Waterloo in June 	
1820-1830	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1820 Missouri Compromise allowed Maine to become a free state and Missouri as a slave state. • 1820 Boone's Lick Road was established in St. Charles; from this road came later the Santa Fe Trail and the Oregon Trail. • 1820 First newspaper established in St. Charles called The Missourian under the leadership of Robert McLoud. • 1821 Missouri admitted as a state on August 10th; St. Charles was the first state 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1823 Bishop DuBourg of St. Louis returned to France. • 1830 Overthrow of King Charles X in July Revolution in which Louis Philippe was placed on the throne.
