WINTER SPORTS TRYOUTS

Winter sport tryouts (Boys Basketball, Girls Basketball, and Girls Swim & Dive) are just around the corner. To be eligible for try-outs, each student must have a current MSHSAA physical form on line with the school. There has been a significant change with MSHSAA regarding physicals.

Athletes Pre-Participation Physical Examination Form is now valid for a two year period from the date of which the physical examination was received. All physicals on file from the 2018-2019 school year are valid until 2020.

Please note some physicals may expire during a sports season and a valid physical would need to be turned in before due date. We will give athletes notice of expiration date at least 30 days prior.

All try-out forms and sports fees MUST be turned into the Main Office before Nov 4. No paperwork or sports fees will be collected at try-outs. Athletes will not be able to try out until all paperwork and fees are turned in.

Duchesne High School Student Log-In Instructions MyPracticeACT.com

Please follow our directions carefully.

- 1. Type <u>www.mypracticeact.com</u> into your internet address bar and press enter.
 - a. You should find yourself on the My Practice ACT "Sign In" page.
 - b. If not, please click on the "Sign In" tab directly to the right of our logo.
- 2. Once you are on the "Sign In" page, please find and click on the empty "User Name" entry box.
- 3. Type in your unique "User Name."
 - a. Your "User Name" is the student identification number given to you on 10/1/19.
 - b. It is a 6 or 7 digit number, one that most likely begins with "21".
- 4. Next, please find and click on the empty "Password" entry box directly below your "User Name."
- 5. Type your "Password" into the box.
 - a. Your "Password" is your last name and your first name, with no spaces, and in that exact order. For example, Joe Smith = smithjoe
 - b. You *do* need to spell your last name and first name completely and in the *exact* same manner that you bubbled it onto your answer sheet.
 - c. You do not need to capitalize any letters in your "Password." Every letter can be lowercase.
 - d. *Do not* include any spaces, apostrophes, or hyphens in your "Password," even if you normally use them to spell your first or last name.
- 6. After you have made sure you have typed your "Password" correctly, according to the conditions listed in Step #6, please press enter or click on the "Sign In" tab to log in.
 - a. If you have trouble logging in, please be sure that you typed both your "User Name" and "Password" correctly AND that you typed them into the correct box.
 - b. Most login troubles arise because of erroneous bubbling of your name or ID number onto your answer sheets.
 - c. If you still have trouble logging in, please e-mail <u>FrontDesk@KleitzEducationGroup.com</u> with your name, graduation year, and your high school's name so that we can assist you.
- 7. Once you have successfully logged in, you should arrive on a page titled "My Dashboard" where your ACT practice test results are available for viewing.

HOMECOMING DANCE INFORMATION SHEET

FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

DATE: Saturday, October12

COST: Tickets will be \$15 dollars per person for the ceremony and dance. They will be sold during lunch periods beginning Wednesday, October 2 and extending through Friday, October 11. Those wishing to attend only the ceremony, will be charged \$5 dollars payable at the door.

CEREMONY: 7:30 - 8:00 (Doors will be locked at 7:30 when the ceremony begins. No one will be admitted until ceremony is complete.) **The ceremony is NOT a pep rally**. It is held with great decorum to honor those on court and their escorts. We ask that you hold your applause until each young woman and her escort is introduced.

ATTIRE: Semi-formal type dress. Ladies wear dresses **appropriate** for a catholic school event. **Keep in mind that if it is too short, too tight, or too revealing we will ask you to go home and change or wear large school polo over the dress.** Gentleman should wear a sport coat and tie, dress pants, dress shoes, dress shirts. (If you do not have a sport coat it is okay.)

DANCE: 8:00 - 10:30 Note: Students must be in the dance by 8:00 or they will be turned away. (Do not make dinner reservations on a Sat. night at 6:00 and think you will be at Duchesne by 8:00.) Students must remain at the dance until 10:00.

This is not a mixer. You do not need to have a date to attend however most who attend either have a date or come with a group of friends who attend Duchesne. You may only invite one date/friend from another school and we ask that you arrive with them.

Remember, you are responsible for the behavior of any guest you invite from another school. Guest Forms can be found on the website under Dean's Page and in the pocket shelves between the bulletin boards outside the cafeteria. <u>A PROPERLY FILLED OUT GUEST FORM MUST PRESENTED TO MR. CLODIUS TO REVIEW AND</u> <u>STAMP BEFORE YOU MAY PURCHASE THE GUEST TICKET.</u>

A purse, bag, backpack, etc. will not be allowed in the PAC. If not left in the car, students who bring any of these items inside will need to check them in the supervised check-in area. If they need to get their bag, etc. during the evening, one of the Faculty will check its contents before returning it to them.

We want Homecoming to be a fun event where we all enjoy ourselves. We expect students to be on their best behavior. Lewd dancing, jumping up on the stage or into the crowd, passing people around on top of the crowd, etc. is not allowed.

IMPORTANT: A number of students will be randomly chosen at the door and asked to move to a secure area where a Breathalyzer test will be administered before they will be allowed to enter the dance. Please do not take a chance and come to the dance under the influence of drugs or alcohol. This ruins the night for that person, all of his/her friends, and the entire school community. A St. Charles police officer will be in attendance, vehicles in the parking lot may be checked, and our Breathalyzer will be available to be used throughout the evening at the discretion of the administration.
