# Q&A

### REGISTRATION

### Can I register for class if I forgot my check?

In order to register for classes, the \$250 check (payable to Duchesne High School and not refundable) needs to accompany the two printed copies of the classes selected. Those students who turn in their registration materials late may have a more difficult time getting into the classes that they would like to take.

# I am a really smart sophomore, can I take AP Courses?

Be sure to check the course prerequisites and requirements when registering for a course. Classes are different and have different standards.

# Is it okay to take more than two PE credits while at DHS?

A student needs to have one Health (Fit and Well) class and two regular P.E. classes for graduation. Students are not allowed to take more than one P.E. class per semester.

# I want to be in the Scholars Academy, what do I do?

Students who qualify to be a part of the Scholars Academy will be contacted about how to apply.

#### Is study hall a required class?

Study hall is not required. It is advisable that if a student has a hard time self-motivating themselves to do work, that they not take a study hall because they will probably just waste their time.

# I did not take a language freshman year but I want to as a sophomore, is that a problem?

No, while most students take a World Language freshman year, not all do. It is not unusual for a sophomore to start taking a language. It is not wise for students to wait until junior year.

#### If I take AP or ACC Classes do I have to pay extra?

In order to get the college credit in an ACC class, a student will have to pay extra to the university where they are getting the credits. If they are taking an AP class and they want to try to earn the credit, there is a fee for taking the end of course test. If a student just wants to take the class without getting "extra" course credits, there is no extra charge.

# In the summer when I get my schedule and see that I am not in ANY classes with my friends, how do I change it?

You can't. Make some new friends.

# **REGISTRATION PROCESS**

- 1. Study the Course Selection Guide for credit requirements and information on the courses available.
- 2. Plan or review your four-year course of study and be sure to do the following:
- Check that you are taking courses necessary to meet all graduation requirements.
- Be sure you meet all the prerequisites for each course you plan to take.
- 3. Discuss your course choices and reasons for them with your parents, teachers, and your counselor.

#### 4. Log into Power School

On the Main Menu, click **Class Registration**. The Class Registration page appears.

- Click the Pencil icon to select courses from each area. A Course Request pop-up window appears.
- Select the appropriate checkbox for each course you want to request. Some of the courses are mandatory so they are chosen automatically.
   (Make sure you choose a class for both first semester and second semester. "a" represents S1 and "b" represents S2.)
- Click Okay. The Course Request pop-up window closes.
- A green checkmark ✓ will appear once you have made your selections and you can move on to the next category. You will notice some categories already have a green check mark; this is due to the fact it is open enrollment. Please make sure you go into those categories even though they are already marked completed.
- A red exclamation mark ! appears if courses need to be selected for a core subject area.
- If you cannot choose a course or it is blocked, please see your teacher so they can recommend the course or let Mrs. Choinka know via email at <a href="mailto:kchoinka@duchesne-hs.org">kchoinka@duchesne-hs.org</a>.

Repeat the steps for each course request.

When finished, click **Submit**. The [Scheduling Year] Course Requests page appears. Please check to make sure all of your choices are correct and you have at least two semesters of Alternate credits chosen **(these cannot be the same courses you have chosen previously).** 

Click the **Print** button on the top of the page. Print two copies, one for records and one to turn in to your Advisory Teacher.

Write your name on the top of the page, and turn it to your advisory teacher with your \$250 registration fee (payable to Duchesne High School).

#### JUNIOR PARENT COLLEGE PLANNING NIGHT

Parents of juniors are invited to a presentation by a Mizzou admissions representative on January 22, at 6:30 p.m. in the DHS cafeteria. The topic will include all aspects of the college search process and will be especially valuable to "first-time-through-the-search" parents. DHS junior students will benefit from similar presentations in February. Junior parents are advised that all DHS juniors will take the ACT free-of-charge on April 2. Registration will be completed at DHS prior to testing.

#### **SENIOR PARENTS**

Remember to record college acceptances and scholarships received on the DHS website. Go to the "Parents" tab, then to "Class of 2019 College Acceptance". Enter each scholarship with the name of the presenting college. Use multiple screens as needed.

#### A+ Scholarship Eligibility Parents!

Parents should remind students to complete the "A+ Intent to Comply Agreement" (DHS website - forms). This form is required for A+ eligibility and must be submitted to Mr. Tinsley by May 1 of the year of graduation.

#### **DHS ITEAM CHOSEN FOR COMPETITION**

Duchesne High School has been chosen to participate in The World Wide Technology 2018-2019 STEM Student Forum! Congratulations to the following iTeam students who will be representing our school: Camilla Delano, Kekoa Disabatino, Luke Hermann, Michael Roettger, Bailey Stefanski, Stephanie Umunna and Dylan Whitlock.

The initiative is focused on educating High School students on the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. At the completion of the Student Hackathon on February 23, the winning school will receive a \$10,000 grant from World Wide Technology and each member of the team will receive a monetary award!

#### CORONATION DANCE INFORMATION SHEET

#### FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

**DATE:** Saturday, February 9

COST: Tickets will be \$15 dollars per person for the ceremony and dance. They will be sold during lunch periods beginning Wednesday, January 30 and extending through Friday, February 8. Those wishing to attend the ceremony only will be charged \$5 dollars payable at the door.

**CEREMONY:** 7:30 - 8:00 (Doors will be locked at 7:30 when the ceremony begins. No one will be admitted until ceremony is complete.) **The ceremony is NOT a pep rally**. It is held with great decorum to honor those on court and their escorts. We ask that you hold your applause until each young woman and her escort is introduced.

ATTIRE: Semi-formal type dress. Ladies wear dresses appropriate for a catholic school event. Keep in mind that if it is too short, too tight, or too revealing we will ask you to go home and change. Gentleman should wear a sport coat and tie, dress pants, dress shoes, dress shirts. (If you do not have a sport coat it is okay.)

DANCE: 8:00 - 10:30 Note: Students must be in the dance by 8:00 or they will be turned away. (Do not make dinner reservations on a Sat. night at 6:00 and think you will be at Duchesne by 8:00.) Students must remain at the dance until 10:00.

This is not a mixer. You do not need to have a date to attend however most who attend either have a date or come with a group of friends who attend Duchesne. You may only invite one date/friend from another school and we ask that you arrive with them.

Remember, you are responsible for the behavior of any guest your invite from another school. Guest Forms can be found on the website under Dean's Page and in the pocket shelves between the bulletin boards outside the cafeteria.

A PROPERLY FILLED OUT GUEST FORM MUST PRESENTED TO MR. CLODIUS TO REVIEW AND STAMP BEFORE YOU MAY PURCHASE THE GUEST TICKET.

A purse, bag, backpack, etc. will not be allowed in the PAC. If not left in the car, students who bring any of these items inside will need to check them in the supervised check-in area. If they need to get their bag, etc. during the evening, one of the faculty will check its contents before returning it to them.

We want Coronation to be a fun event where we all enjoy ourselves. We expect students to be on their best behavior. Lewd dancing, jumping up on the stage or into the crowd, passing people around on top of the crowd, etc. is not allowed.

IMPORTANT: A number of students will be randomly chosen at the door and asked to move to a secure area where a Breathalyzer test will be administered before they will be allowed to enter the dance. Please do not take a chance and come to the dance under the influence of drugs or alcohol. This ruins the night for that person, all of his/her friends, and the entire school community. A St. Charles police officer will be in attendance, vehicles in the parking lot may be checked, and our Breathalyzer will be available to be used throughout the evening at the discretion of the administration.

Many of you visited with parents, aunts, and uncles who are over the age of 70 during the holidays. Did you know that at age 70.5 years, the government requires people to start taking a distribution from most types of retirement plans? This is called a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). Friends and relatives of Duchesne who are 70.5 years and older can check with their investment or tax advisor to see about making a donation of their RMD to Duchesne. This could gain them a tax deduction while putting the benefit of the full amount to work for our school.
