Duchesne Delivers - Athletic Accolades

 \mathcal{D} uchesne honored Courtney Reimer '16 and recognized her soccer career by retiring her jersey #16 on April 22, 2021. Courtney's legendary performances and sportsmanship have been enshrined into Pioneer Soccer history, and what a storied history it is.

Courtney played varsity soccer throughout her four years at Duchesne, from 2013 to 2016. After graduating, Courtney continued her education and soccer career at Saint Louis University.

While at DHS, Courtney was a 4-time State Champion, 4-time AAA All Conference selection, 3-time Post-Dispatch All Metro, All Decade Second Team, 2016 Player of the Year All Midwest Selection, Post-Dispatch Scholar Athlete, Missouri Athletic Club Senior All Star, and All State Academic her senior year. Number 16 in Pioneer Blue became a number that was on every opponent's radar. Now number 16 in Pioneer Blue is memorialized at Duchesne forever.

As a Billiken at SLU, Courtney was named to the All Rookie team her freshman year, Second Team All Conference her sophomore year, First Team All Conference her junior year, and MVP at the conference tournament during her senior year. She became the first ever Billiken to win the A-10 Midfielder of the Year award. Additionally, she received All Academic honors all four years. Courtney graduated from Saint Louis University with a master's degree in Occupational Therapy.

Family, coaches, and teammates all agree that Courtney is as amazing off the field as she was on. Her mom, Terri (Schultehenrich) Reimer '88, summed up the general consensus: "She is someone who never cared about personal recognition; she just wanted the team to win. Whether it was soccer or basketball, she would always pass to her teammate if she thought they had a better shot. She never complained about going from one practice to the next because she was committed to being there for her team."

The Wall of Champions is the Duchesne Athletic Boosters' tribute to every athlete who has won a State Championship for the Pioneers. It is located near the entrance to the football stadium. The Wall of Champions includes a "State Champions" sign and a single brick engraved for every team or individual who has won first place at state competitions.

DHS Graduates Lead ACA

The 2021 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) of the Archdiocese of St. Louis set a record for the most ever raised, exceeding \$15.9 million in donations and pledges. With estate gifts and anticipated matching gifts, the appeal raised more than \$16.4 million. Duchesne graduate Marsha (Weber) Stocker '71 chaired the 2021 ACA campaign, which exceeded its goal by almost \$850,000.

"Your incredible generosity impacts the lives of those in need in so many ways and gives witness to the unity of our faith," Marsha said. "Even in the midst of a pandemic and changes in church attendance, our donors continued to generously share their gifts. We were blessed to exceed our goal, and therefore give additional support to so many people in need."

DAB Drive-Thru BBQ

The Duchesne Athletic Boosters held their first drive-thru barbecue during the spring of the 2020-2021 school year. Inspired by the need to have their fundraiser and stay covid cautious, the DAB members, concessions coordinators Greg and Kim Saguto, and their student volunteers found a way to make it work.

Shortly after the event, Mr. Saguto asked us to share his impressions with Pioneer Nation:

"WOW!!! I knew we had <u>GREAT</u> students at Duchesne, but Saturday absolutely blew me away! At the ... Duchesne Athletic Boosters BBQ fundraiser I had the privilege to work with quite a few of them. While understaffed, these volunteers completed set-up a good 30 minutes early, served ~800 meals between I I-5, and had everything cleaned up by 6:30. Not sure what else they could have done... As impressive as the volume of work performed, what really stood-out to me was HOW they accomplished these tasks. The maturity, attitude, leadership, teamwork, confidence, critical thinking, communication skills, and work ethic of these "kids" (young adult volunteers) was awe-inspiring... I "taught" the first group of runners and servers around 10:30 in the morning by giving them some preliminary guidance and thoughts on how to take, fill, and collect payment for orders. These young men and women then proceeded to figure out the details and implemented a quick and smooth ordering and food delivery process. By itself this was great, but they did not stop there. They owned the process by teaching and mentoring their peers for the next shift. So, after the rudimentary directions I supplied prior to the first shift, no additional oversight was needed. **IMPRESSIVE & OUTSTANDING!!!** I would like to compliment the parents, teachers, staff, and administration of Duchesne. We are truly God Blessed for all that you do, guiding and teaching the next generation of responsible and productive adults."





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Carry A Piece of the Holy Land With You

This is the motto Fr. Bill Kneemiller '68 established for his charity, The Holy Land Military Rosary. Fr. Bill is a veteran of the Military Chaplaincy for the Army Reserves. He joined the priesthood in 1999 and the Army Reserves in 2001, after which he served in three overseas deployments.

During his last year in the seminary, Fr. Bill had a clear indication of his "call within a call." When passing through a TV lounge, he saw Fr. Mulcahy from MASH wearing his Roman collar combined with an Army jacket. Fr. Bill then "saw" internally a large-lettered message: "YOU ARE GOING TO BE A U.S. ARMY MILITARY CHAPLAIN!" He felt God calling him to be a priest for our brave men and women who are deployed.

After some time in the Army Reserves, Fr. Bill saw a need for Catholic soldiers to have something easy to carry around with them to help them pray, as well as feel closer to Jesus and His birthplace. He decided an olive-wood crucifix rosary from Bethlehem would be the perfect fit.

These rosaries are made out of military parachute cord, plastic beads, and a handmade olive-wood crucifix made by native Catholics in Bethlehem. The Holy Land Rosaries are then distributed to deployed military Catholics. Purchasing them helps the Catholics of Bethlehem earn income critical to their survival. But the highest goal of this charity is to promote Christian strength, courage, and peace to members of the U.S. armed services.

There are 60 Catholic families living in and around Bethlehem, where the largest source of income pre-COVID had been tourism. Ghassan Alsahouri, Fr. Bill's contact for the

Bethlehem-area native Catholics, recently reported that since the COVID-19 pandemic, Bethlehem has been forced to close churches, tourism is at an all-time low, and many native Catholics are nearly destitute and poverty-stricken.

However, the natives do still have the opportunity to sell olive-wood crucifixes and other olive-wood products. The cost for the olive-wood crucifix is a modest \$2 each when buying a quantity of 1,000. Fr. Bill purchases the crucifixes from the Bethlehem area Catholics, and then the rosaries are assembled in Muscatine, Iowa. Upon completion, they are donated to the Augustine Institute, which mails them to military chaplains around the world. In early 2021, Holy Land Military Rosaries was able to purchase 5,000 olive-wood crucifixes. And demand is going up! Donations are needed to keep this mission operating to benefit military personnel as well as native Catholics in Bethlehem.

Fr. Bill has also started making and distributing one-decade rosaries for school children, calling them Holy Land Decade Rosaries. They are wonderful for teaching younger children how to pray the Rosary. Decade Rosaries are sold to U.S. Catholic grade schools for \$1 apiece; a hand-sewn cloth rosary case is included. All funds go directly to the native Catholic families in Bethlehem.

WEBER CLAN GATHERS AT CATHOLIC FAMILY CAMP

Family reunions usually include various branches of a large family all coming together where they originally grew up, coming back to their hometown. But the family of Nettie and the late Bill Weber travel from their current places of residence to a Catholic family camp in Bloomingdale, Ohio, about 20 minutes from Franciscan University in Steubenville.

Run by the Apostolate for Family Consecration, Catholic Family Land is where the Webers have gathered each summer for 29 years in a row! -- to pray and play, and rest, renew, reconnect, and recreate.

"Most of the kids have made it every year. Now my grandkids and great-grandchildren are coming too," said Nettie, 90. "There were over 50 of us there this last summer, which was really nice because we hadn't seen a lot of one another for a while because of COVID. It's wonderful to see my family stay connected to one another and to our Catholic faith."

Nettie's kids and grandkids include DHS graduates Marsha Stocker '71, Margot Kyd '71, Kent Weber '80, Drew '04 and Lindsay (Hepler) '04 Weber, and Kevin Weber '09.

"My twin sister, Margot, lives in the San Diego area but joins us most years," Marsha said. "My husband and I have lived with Mom in St. Charles since my dad died in 2008 but we lived in Kentucky for 30 years before that. Kent and his family all live in



St. Charles. Some of my other siblings and their kids and grandkids live in Arizona and Texas. But we all get together in Ohio!"

"We've met people from as far as Europe, Africa, and Asia," Marsha continued. "No one is a stranger at Catholic Family Land. There is a spiritual connection because we all share common beliefs and values."

Catholic Family Land has all the traditional camp offerings, like swimming, fishing, and hiking. There are also basketball and volleyball courts, a shuffleboard court, corn hole boards, softball and soccer fields, several children's play areas, hammocks, a snack shack, and a bookstore. Accommodations offered include cottages and cabins, RV rentals, and campsites ranging from full service to primitive.

There are over a dozen special places for prayer, including chapels, gardens, and a grotto. The highlights of the week are when the family rosary is said around the campfire after dinner, and when the teenagers gather at night and receive love-affirming letters from their parents.

"It's a unique place and a life-changing experience. Faith and family, that's what it's all about," Marsha said.

2021 PIONEER EXPEDITION AUCTION AND FUND OUR FUTURE FUND-A-NEED

2021 Teacher Excellence Award



Glennis Ziegler

Duchesne's Teacher Excellence Award is bestowed upon a teacher who has demonstrated a unique, student-centered lesson or project. Glennis Ziegler won the 2021 award for her ongoing dedication to student learning and enrichment through involvement in the classroom and beyond, as exhibited through her ACC Anatomy class's year-end research projects and presentations.

"In my ACC Anatomy class, not only do my students learn the academics of anatomy and physiology, they also learn about careers in science and medicine. Their year-end project requires them to research the field they are most interested in. They learn about everything from the schooling involved and what that costs to what a day in the life of that specific field is like – a complete picture of exactly what the career would involve from training to employment. They

then present their findings to their peers. This gives students the opportunity to make informed decisions about a given career path before they start college. Sometimes they make the decision to continue in the field they initially chose; sometimes they change their mind and decide to look at a different aspect of that career or change career paths completely, totally based on their own research or someone else's presentation.

"This process can save our college-bound students time and money once they enter university. Even more importantly, it gives them confidence in their decision-making process for their next steps after Duchesne and practice in how to best approach major life decisions through thoughtful analysis."

Glennis graduated from Southeast Missouri State University with a double major in chemistry and biology and a minor in math. Shortly after college, she married and moved from southeast Missouri to Old Monroe, where she supplemented the family income with sewing and eventually substitute teaching at Immaculate Conception in Old Monroe (ICOM) grade school. She was an active participant in her children's activities as well as in her community and church, where she taught PSR for grades 5 and 6.

When her youngest went to kindergarten, Glennis decided to pursue teaching full time and attended Lindenwood University, where she received her teaching certification in Unified Sciences with middle school and high school endorsements. She worked at ICOM as the 7th grade homeroom/religion teacher and also taught Science and Literature for grades 6, 7, and 8. During this time, Glennis also obtained a Master's in Education from Lindenwood.

Glennis joined the Duchesne faculty in 2004, teaching Fundamental Chemistry and Biology. Since then, she's taught almost every science class Duchesne offers, including Anatomy & Physiology and Biology as dual enrollment classes, for which she earned additional certification from the University of Missouri – St. Louis.

In addition, Glennis has worked with our students in a number of extracurricular roles, including costume designer for the musicals, recycle coordinator, and sophomore class moderator. For the last 10 years, Glennis has been the moderator for the Science Olympiad team and for the WYSE/ACES academic team (World Youth in Science and Engineering which then became Academic Challenge in Engineering and Science).

Under Glennis's guidance, the Science Olympiad team has sent qualifiers to state every year, whether it was a full team or a few individual event winners. The WYSE/ACES team has placed in the top three at state every year since they started competing. These are amazing accomplishments!!

"All students have the ability to learn but most believe science is too hard for them," Glennis said. "I want them to enjoy science and explore the opportunities it has to offer them."

In her free time, Glennis keeps up with her adult children and their families. Brittany is a pre-school special ed teacher, captain in the Army National Guard, and mom to Glennis's two beautiful grandchildren, Will and Morgan. Aaron works at a commercial landscaping company and spends his spare time taking care of the landscaping at Glennis's house. Anna works in international business for a commercial insurance broker. She loves to travel and Glennis was able to join her during spring break a few years ago for a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Europe.

2021 Spirit of Duchesne Alumni Achievement Award

J. Michael Conoyer, MD

Dr. J. Michael "Mike" Conoyer is a Class of 1968 Duchesne graduate and one of three Pioneer siblings. He married a classmate, Carol Wappelhorst '68, and they had three children who also went to Duchesne: Matt '95, Ben '97, and Ellie '00. Mike was a leader when he and Carol were at Duchesne and he hasn't slowed down since!

As a Pioneer, Mike served as captain for varsity basketball, a sport he enjoyed all four years. He also ran track for four years. He was an officer for his junior class and the Key Club, was sports editor for Leaves (the student newspaper name at the time), and was a member of the Honor Society for three years and Quill & Scroll (a journalism honor society) for two years. Mike was the class valedictorian at Duchesne.



He then went on to graduate summa cum laude from Southeast Missouri State University in three years and subsequently received a medical degree from Vanderbilt University. He completed his ENT residency at Washington University in St. Louis in 1980 and was named a diplomate by the American Board of Otolaryngology.

Mike later pioneered a successful group otolaryngology practice when he founded Midwest ENT Centre, a single-specialty, multi-physician adult and pediatric ear, nose, and throat practice dedicated to providing a full range of ENT services, including audiology, allergy, and sinus issues, in addition to hearing aid devices. (His sons Matt and Ben are Midwest ENT Centre physicians as well.)

Along the way, Mike was professionally active outside of his practice and found time to volunteer and contribute to the greater community. A sampling of his medical involvement includes serving as president of the Missouri State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts (Missouri's medical licensing board), and being the chairman of that group's disciplinary committee for four terms; holding a part-time teaching position in otolaryngology at Washington University for over 20 years; and membership in the Missouri State Medical Association for 20 years before resigning from that group because of their stance on abortion. Mike was a charter member of the St. Peters Ambulatory Surgery Center, former chairman of the surgery audit committee at St. Joseph Health Center and Hospital West, and chief of surgery and chairman of multiple committees at Barnes St. Peters Hospital.

He is a fellow in the American Academy of Otolaryngology, the American College of Surgeons, the American Society for Head and Neck Surgery, and the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. Additionally, Mike was the sole recipient of the American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery National Award for Practitioner Excellence in 1996. He was featured as the keynote speaker at the Idaho State Medical Association's 1999 convention, where he addressed "The Judeo-Christian Influence on Medical Ethics."

Locally, Mike has been honored by United Services for the Handicapped and Youth In Need for charitable service. He was named Citizen of the Years by the St. Charles Chamber of Commerce in 1994 and received the 2004 St. Peters Chamber of Commerce Distinguished Business Leadership Award. He recently completed a term as chairman of the Lindenwood University Board of Trustees, a group he served in various capacities for 15 years. He has also served as a board member for Drug-Free Missouri, the Boys and Girls Club of St. Charles County, the St. Charles County Handicapped Facilities Board, the St. Charles County Charter Commission, and the St. Charles County Businessmen's Prayer Breakfast Organizational Committee, among other groups.

Now retired, Mike's latest achievement is being named as Chair of the St. Louis Archdiocese's Annual Catholic Appeal, which supports more than 30 archdiocesan ministries in the areas of Catholic Education, Pastoral Services, Catholic Charities, and Administration & Communications. He was instrumental in obtaining space for Lindenwood's Newman Center, where our own Fr. Eddie Voltz is the chaplain.

Mike has been active in his parish and supported Catholic education throughout his life, including nearly 10 years of service on Duchesne's advisory board, working as vice-chair for a past Duchesne building campaign, and chairing an Academy of the Sacred Heart capital campaign.

Mike and Carol are members of the Roman Catholic Foundation's Legacy Circle and patrons of Friends of the Cathedral, in addition to supporting Kenrick-Glennon Seminary and a number of Catholic charities. He co-founded Businessmen Serving Mary, serves as an RCIA instructor at St. Cletus, and has made pilgrimages to Medjugorje, Rome, and the Holy Land.

Mike's hobbies include hunting, travel, politics, and reading, especially books by Catholic authors. He and Carol enjoy spending time with their family, which includes seven grandchildren.

During his time at Lindenwood Tom worked in the admissions office, where he was introduced to the information technology path and his career in IT began with that hands-on experience. Tom was responsible for automating some of the workflow and based on such project work, Lindenwood essentially lent Tom to the St. Charles County Economic Development Council to help lead their Small Business Incubator (then called the Synergy Center). Tom was exposed to the entrepreneurial spirit and loved the pace and energy.

Tom worked for a couple of small companies before landing at GE Capital IT Solutions. He spent two years with GE before finding a home at Edward Jones, where he spent 15 years in the Network and Field Services areas. All was good with the world. Then he received a call from

Not only did he put in the time to make this operation a success, he purchased equipment and technical devices out of his own pocket to further the project.

The livestreaming was a success and kept Pioneer Nation in touch with our students' activities. Some of this past year's stream analytics show we had more than 18,000 viewers, more than 100,000 impressions, and more than 300 subscribers. Tom also trained a couple students on how to livestream our athletic games, performing arts, and anything else we might need filmed. Not only is Tom giving back to Duchene with his time, talent, and treasure, he is shaping future leaders by training his student team.

MR. TIM RICHARDSON

We bid a fond farewell to Tim Richardson after 30 years at Duchesne. Tim started his career at Ursuline Academy, then he was at Rosary for 10 years, then at St. Thomas Aquinas/Mercy. His position there was eliminated due to a loss of enrollment but the administrator said he'd find something for Tim. The job at Duchesne became open and Tim called it the place "where the Lord finally wanted me" to be. Tim taught theology for his whole career. He did computer work at our school for 15 years "in the infancy of what Kim Choinka does now."

Highlights of Tim's years at Duchesne include:

- Decades of early morning prayer groups that had over 60 kids participating.
- One particular prayer group when a student felt pulled out of his senses and that God communicated with him directly.
- A day of Eucharistic adoration put together by Mr. Richardson, Fr. Gahan, and Ms. Dickherber that had over 300 kids packed in the chapel at the conclusion.
- When students at Duchesne had parents who were Tim's students at his previous schools, and kids discussed what they were doing in class as compared to what their parents studied in Mr. Richardson's class. "How great is that, to have kids talking about theology at home!"
- The Death and Dying class he used to teach freshmen.
- Teaching Theological Foundations and Scripture for college credit at Saint Louis University for 15 years. "I really enjoyed that because my background is in scripture."

- Teaching Mr. D'Urso as a student!

As part of the SLU faculty, Tim contributed a chapter to a theology book. His topic was Christology, the study of Jesus Christ. "We just take for granted that Jesus was always seen as God, and that wasn't true. It took 500 years for the Church to determine who the person of Jesus was. The Creed we say at Mass is the result of hundreds of years of study and debate about who Jesus was."

Tim felt a call to retire and knows God has a plan for him. "I know the Lord has more things ahead for me to do. I keep myself open to whatever else he brings me, and I will respond."

Though Tim is on our sub list now, we will miss his daily presence and caring nature. We will also miss Tim's sign-off with prayer at the end of each school day. "Use the crosswalk and no texting!" has become an iconic line that will always remind us of Mr. Richardson!

MRS. RUTH DULTZ

Ruth (Sebacher) Dultz '82 turned in her coach's whistle at the end of the 2020-2021 season after working with our girls swim team for 9 years, first as an assistant coach and then as head coach. "Early in my career I went to a clinic and they said you don't coach a sport, you coach kids, and you use the sport to do that. I was coaching young women more than I was coaching swimming," Ruth said.

"The biggest highlights of my coaching career were not a single win or a new record, but when kids came back and told me I had helped them at a time in their life when they needed help; that means everything," Ruth continued. "Seeing the girls develop confidence, poise, grace, the ability to get up in front of a group to speak and lead them – those are the high points – those things are more exciting even than winning.

"Coaching at Duchesne helped me to be a better person at my regular job, which is also coaching people," she said. Ruth is in charge of the interpreters at the Saint Louis Zoo. Her team there interprets the animals' actions and the science connected to caring for the animals. They talk about conservation and what the zoo is doing.

"It was a good year for me to step out because it wasn't a big group I was leaving, only three team members (after the seniors graduated). It was a challenging year at work with COVID, so it was a good decision to leave DHS when I did, and it was easier knowing there was a new coach in place." Megan Schauwecker is the team's coach for 2021-2022.

MR. CHUCK NOLAN RETIRES AFTER THREE TOURS AT DUCHESNE

Charles L. "Chuck" Nolan Jr. retired from his six-year role as president (2015-2021) at the end of June. Mr. Nolan also served Duchesne from 1991-2000 as principal and administrator, and from 1977-1986 as an English teacher and coach. More than half of his 40+ year career in St. Louis Archdiocesan high schools was spent on our campus. His last "Nolan's Notes" message to our faculty and staff summarizes his experiences at Duchesne.

This is my last day as President of Duchesne High School. These past six years have been amazing to me for many reasons. First and foremost has been the fact that I had the privilege of returning to Duchesne to round out my career in Catholic Education. I have been fond of saying that I have had three separate opportunities to relate to the Duchesne Community - first as a teacher of English and coach, then as Principal and Administrator, and finally as President.

TEACHER OF ENGLISH AND COACH

My hope as a teacher was always to attempt to make the literature I was teaching come alive for my students. As I look back on those years, I can honestly say I tried to do that and I have been told by some students that I never "dumbed it down" and I kept them on their toes using slightly unconventional methods for the times. As a coach, I tried to motivate players to be teammates and to think less of their individual talents. Some tell stories about running through the snow with their legs tied together. Most of those stories are true.

PRINCIPAL AND ADMINISTRATOR

My first stint as chief administrator at Duchesne was after Fr. Wunderlich

had left and I was given the responsibility of completing the capital campaign that built the gym. I can remember being quite intimidated by this responsibility and relying heavily on the experience of men like Henry Elmendorf, Mike Conoyer, MD, Ted Glosier, Henry Clever Jr., MD, etc... Before I left in 2000, we also rebuilt the athletic stadium.

PRESIDENT

These past six years we have been on a quest to keep enrollment stable, renovate classrooms, and keep Duchesne financially viable in the face of changing demographics, increased costs, and tuition assistance needs. I know I have been fortunate that the Duchesne community has risen to this challenge.

I have so many people to thank. Too many to list here. I just want the Duchesne Community to know of my appreciation to all of you for your support in what has been a challenging and long career, trying to educate students in the Light of Christ. May God bless the Duchesne Community abundantly, and may God bless my successor, Susan Noonan, with wisdom, energy, and the support of the Duchesne Community.

Father Ferdinand "Ferd" Wesloh was ordained in 1964, and served the St. Louis area as a priest for nearly 50 years before being granted retirement status in 2012. He passed at the age of 79 in 2018. Though Father Wesloh is gone, memories of him live on among many of Duchesne's alumni and friends.

His first assignment was as assistant pastor at St. Peter Parish and Duchesne High School in St. Charles, where he stayed until 1974. At Duchesne, Father Wesloh was a guidance counselor and taught Religion as well as Latin.

"Though Father Wesloh left Duchesne after my junior year there, he was a strong influence on me and a stand-out among the positive experiences I had at DHS," said Brad Huesemann '75.

"More than a religion teacher, Father Wesloh was truly a guidance counselor, in that he helped guide students – this one in particular – in making better choices as we navigated all the challenges and opportunities high school brings with it," Brad continued. "He was a big guy, but not at all intimidating. He had a warm and welcoming manner that put a high school kid at ease and made him approachable. He wasn't judgmental, yet he helped me improve the judgments I made. Father Wesloh really made a difference in my life and helped me to become a better person."

Brian Klutenkamper '75 remembers Father Wesloh from when he served Masses at St. Peter's during his 7th and 8th grade years there. Brian remembers Father Wesloh as "a great religion counselor" and someone who helped guide his adult life as well. Father Wesloh led the marriage preparation class for Brian and his wife, Debbie, and then co-celebrated their wedding. "That was nearly 45 years ago!" Brian said.

"Father Wesloh and I stayed in contact for several years when he was at a number of other assignments," Brian continued. "The most impressive thing to me was that he was always there and willing to help anyone who needed his guidance and support. He made an indelible impression on me and many of my classmates."

Cathy (Wucher) Boschert '72 also remembers Father Wesloh well: "Don (Class of 1971) and I were



married by Father Wesloh in 1973. I always enjoyed his smile and felt a spiritual presence when he was around."

Steve Borgmeyer '69 added, "I have fond memories of Father Wesloh as a young priest who came to St. Peter's parish while I was in grade school. He then taught at DHS during my time as a Pioneer. I remember Father Wesloh being very dedicated to Catholic education. He was humble, soft-spoken, and caring – a priest I admired."

"Duchesne has developed a lot of leaders throughout the school's history," Brad summarized. "Father Wesloh lived the school's current motto long before it was officially adopted; he was a pioneer in Duchesne High School's mission of shaping leaders in mind, body, and spirit."

Duchesne's Families Helping Families Tuition Assistance Program is a multi-year tuition assistance commitment that provides our school with critical funding and the ability to work with prospective parents to help make Duchesne affordable for them. Last spring marked the fifth anniversary of this community-supported fund. With the ever-increasing need for tuition assistance, we must also increase our number of participants in the program, and we are happy to report we have done that each year.

Some families are remembering a deceased family member by making a Families Helping Families commitment in their loved one's honor. Members of the Cannon family began doing so last year with an FHF commitment to Duchesne in memory of Cindy (Cannon) Brooks '79, who passed unexpectedly in September 2015. This year, Kathy and Ellie '21 Sullivan did the same in memory of their dear husband and father, John, who died last year after suffering from ALS.



David Runde '76 contacted Duchesne in late spring to discuss what he could do to honor his brother, Dan '68, who had passed away in May. David chose to participate in Families Helping Families as a way to pay tribute to Dan and the experience they both had while at Duchesne.

During his senior year, Dan Runde was Duchesne's first Student Council presi-

dent. His leadership abilities shone earlier on: Dan was sophomore class president and junior class vice president. Dan was also a central figure in Duchesne's "service club," the predecessor to our Key Club. He was on the Leaves staff for three years and in Quill & Scroll (an international high school journalism honor society) for two years. He was in the play all four years and in the Drama Club his last three years, serving as vice president as a junior. Athletically, Dan played basketball during his freshman and sophomore years, and soccer as a junior and senior. He ran track all four years and participated in cross country as a junior.

Dan joined the U.S. Army in 1970 and went to Vietnam, where he was a gunner in a Huey helicopter. After two years in the Army, Dan was given an honorable discharge and awarded a Bronze Star medal. He earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Missouri in Columbia in 1974 and a law degree from the University of Arkansas in 1977. In 1986, he moved to Columbia, TN, where he served as a public defender for 10 years, then as Assistant District Attorney for more than 20 years. Dan was known to have "...an intimidating presence in the workplace... and one the biggest hearts of Middle Tennessee's many attorneys."



A newspaper article in the Columbia (TN) Daily Herald quoted Dan's coworker, District Attorney Brent Cooper, as saying, "He had a vocabulary that was apparently endless.... He could be a poet in the courtroom, quoting Shakespeare, or he could be quoting lines from famous movies. Judges would occasionally have to ask Dan for the definition of a word he would use."

"My siblings and I received a great education at Duchesne!" David Runde said. "I am so proud of all my big brother accomplished and of who he was as a person. I am blessed in retirement to be able to honor Dan in this way and pleased to make this annual commitment to help today's Pioneers."



David and Dan's parents and sisters are also alumni. Now deceased, Glennon '40 and Arlene (Orf) '46 graduated from St. Peters High School, Duchesne's forerunner; siblings Barbara (Runde) Reading '70, Patricia (Runde) Stewart '73, and Kathy (Runde) Schillinger '75 all went to Duchesne. In addition to his siblings, Dan is survived by his wife, Fran, and three children: Debbie, Brian, and Elizabeth.

Planned Giving

WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING?

Creating a Planned Gift enables individuals like you to make larger gifts to Duchesne High School than you could make from ordinary income. Planned Giving is sometimes referred to as Gift Planning or Legacy Giving.

All Planned Gifts are created during the lifetime of you, the donor. Some Planned Gifts, however, are completed during your lifetime as part of your financial planning process, while others will not be completed until after your lifetime and are therefore part of your estate plan.

Roman Catholic Foundation

GIVE NOW:

Typically a gift of appreciated assets, the gift will either create a new endowment fund or add to an existing endowment fund at the Roman Catholic Foundation to benefit Duchesne High School. The appropriate tax deduction is provided to the donor by the Foundation.

GIVE LATER:

Typically a gift made through language in your will or trust, by beneficiary designation on an IRA or Insurance Policy, or as a beneficiary on a piece of property. The estate will receive appropriate acknowledgment of the gift from the Foundation.

GIVE & RECEIVE:

Typically, such a gift is centered on either the creation of a Charitable Gift Annuity or a Charitable Remainder Trust. In both circumstances, a gift (typically of a highly appreciated asset) is made to the Foundation and the donor receives an agreed-upon income stream for a period of time. As the donor, you will receive a tax deduction in accordance with tax laws in effect at the time the gift is received by the Foundation.

Whether a donor uses cash, appreciated securities/stock, real estate, artwork, partnership interests, life insurance, a retirement plan, etc., the benefits of funding a Planned Gift can make this type of charitable giving very attractive to both you and Duchesne High School.

Your desire to create a Planned Gift allows you to:

- · Establish a lasting legacy to honor those you love
- Designate how your gift is to be used
- Feel comfortable knowing that your gift, if used to add to or create an endowment at the Roman to Catholic Foundation, will be managed in accordance with Catholic values.
