REENACTMENT OF ST. ROSE PHILIPPINE

When:

- September 7, 2018.
 - Grades school students and visitors will be arriving between 9:00 and 10:15.
 - The program will start at 10:30.

Where:

Frontier Park on the St. Charles riverfront.

Who:

- Anyone is welcome to attend. Bring your own chairs if you do not want to sit on the ground.
 - There will be special Duchesne Alum seating on the right when looking at the stage.
- Over 2,000 grade school students will be attending as well as dignitaries and other special guests.
- Duchesne students will be working and running all of the festivities.

Driving Directions:

- Please park in the Lewis & Clark Boathouse Parking Lot, 1050 South Riverside Drive, St Charles, 63301.
- Once parked, proceed to the north end of the parking lot and walk across the pedestrian bridge to enter Frontier Park.

Duchesne Involvement:

- Duchesne students will start to be bussed down to the park at 8:00 a.m.
- Each student has been assigned a job for the Reenactment.
 - These were divided by House, and many of the new students are assigned with their mentor.
 - Most students will be working with the more than 2,000 grade school students attending.
- Once the program is finished, grade schools have left, and the park is clean – the Duchesne students will be bussed back to school.
 - Attendance will be taken in Communio once everyone is back and then they will be dismissed from school.



FROM THE GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT PSAT

Sophomore and Junior Parents! The PSAT will be offered at DHS, during the day on Wednesday, October 10 (rather than Oct. 17). Junior and sophomore students will be informed of the details in the coming weeks. Registration is open and the \$18 fee may be made in the Guidance Office until September 21. Please make check payable to DHS.

The PSAT is an optional test that primarily serves as a practice for the SAT and also is the qualifier for the National Merit Scholarship program. It is not used for college admission purposes.

ACT

The website for ACT is www.act.org - September 28 is the regular registration deadline for anyone wishing to take the October 27 test. Seniors creating an ACT account can sync the scores from the test taken in May at Duchesne (during the school day) by entering the ID number found on the test results mailed to their home. If the student has difficulty with the process, they should contact ACT for assistance.

For students requiring accommodations...if you were granted an accommodation on the April test, you will receive the same accommodations this year. During the registration process you will be asked to identify your need in some way.

HOMECOMING DANCE INFORMATION SHEET FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

DATE: Saturday, September 29, 2018

COST: Tickets will be \$15 dollars per person for the ceremony and dance. They will be sold during lunch periods beginning Friday, September 21. Those wishing to attend the ceremony only will be charged \$5 dollars payable at the door.

CEREMONY: 7:30-8:00 (Doors will be locked at 7:30 when the ceremony begins. No one will be admitted until ceremony is complete.) **The ceremony is NOT a pep rally**. It is held with great decorum to honor those on court and their escorts. We ask that you hold your applause until each young woman and her escort is introduced.

ATTIRE: Semi-formal type dress. Ladies wear dresses appropriate for a catholic school event. Keep in mind that if it is too short, too tight, or too revealing we will ask you to go home and change or wear a large school polo over the dress. Gentleman should wear a sport coat and tie, dress pants, dress shoes, dress shirts. (If you do not have a sport coat it is okay.)

DANCE: 8:00-10:30 Note: Students must be in the dance by 8:00 or they will be turned away. (Do not make dinner reservations on a Sat. night at 6:00 and think you will be at Duchesne by 8:00.) Students must remain at the dance until 10:00.

This is not a mixer. You do not need to have a date to attend however most who attend either have a date or come with a group of friends who attend Duchesne. You may only invite one date/friend from another school and we ask that you arrive with them.

Remember, you are responsible for the behavior of any guest you invite from another school. Guest Forms can be found on the website under Dean's Page in the student life section, under the Students heading, in Mr. Clodius' office, and in the pocket shelves between the bulletin boards outside the cafeteria. THE FORM MUST BE BROUGHT TO MR. CLODIUS, STAMPED, AND THEN PRESENTED WITH YOUR MONEY, BEFORE YOU MAY PURCHASE THE GUEST TICKET.

A purse, bag, backpack, etc. will not be allowed in the PAC. If not left in the car, students who bring any of these items inside will need to check them in the supervised check-in area. If they need to get their bag, etc. during the evening, one of the faculty will check its contents before returning it to them.

We want Homecoming to be a fun event where we all enjoy ourselves. We expect students to be on their best behavior. Lewd dancing, jumping up on the stage or into the crowd, passing people around on top of the crowd, etc. is not allowed.

IMPORTANT: A number of students will be randomly chosen at the door and asked to move to a secure area where a Breathalyzer test will be administered before they will be allowed to enter the dance. Please do not take a chance and come to the dance under the influence of drugs or alcohol. This ruins the night for that person and all of his/her friends. A St. Charles police officer will be in attendance, vehicles in the parking lot may be checked, and our Breathalyzer will be available to be used throughout the evening at the discretion of the administration.
