I hope this message finds all of you healthy, happy, and ready for a great new year at Duchesne.

I am very excited to work with your students and help prepare them for their next path in life.

Should you ever have questions

or concerns regarding your child, please do not hesitate to reach out to me. I am here to help!

As we strive to prepare your children for their next phase in life, we have made some adjustments to the Parent/Student Handbook for the 2022-23 school year. The most pertinent changes are as follows:

SENIORS ONLY:

- Seniors are not required to wear the traditional school polo as long as they are wearing an approved DHS hoodie or sweatshirt with uniform bottoms. If your senior is not wearing a hoodie or sweatshirt, they must wear the school polo.
- Senior boys are not required to be clean-shaven. However, their facial hair must appear neat and wellkept.
 - Seniors may qualify for Unsched-

uled Time if they meet the weekly academic standards.

This privilege goes into effect once the 2nd week of the quarter is complete.

• Seniors may decorate their parking spaces with (an approved) design.

ALL PIONEERS:

- In an effort to get students to class in a timely fashion, snacks will not be sold in the cafeteria throughout the day. Snacks may be purchased before school and/or during lunch.
- Students that are taking a Study Hall will be required to remain in the classroom and will no longer be allowed to be "unscheduled" throughout the building. Of course, students may sign out of study hall with a pass in order to work with a tutor or teacher during their study hall.

president of the PPA and is excited to offer parents more opportunities to engage with Duchesne's faculty and student body.



AP & ACC CLASSES

Students currently enrolled in AP and ACC classes will need to enroll for college credit over the next few weeks. Registration for the AP test will happen on September 23 and September 24. AP exam fees are \$97 per exam. Students with questions should speak to Mr. Tinsley or their AP/ACC teacher.

PSAT FOR JUNIORS & SOPHOMORES

Juniors and sophomores are invited to take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 12, here at DHS. The cost for this optional test is \$19, payable by check to DHS and turned in to Mr. Tinsley in the Guidance Office. The deadline for registration is October 4. The PSAT is used to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship competition and is not used for college entrance or scholarship consideration. SENIOR PARENTS

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

All seniors have been advised as to how transcripts are requested through Naviance Student. Fifteen-percent of the senior class has applied to their target schools and many have received their acceptance letters. Please encourage your senior to continue to visit campuses, virtually or in-person, and to use Naviance Student to complete their applications.

COLLEGE & FINANCIAL AID

Senior parents, especially, are encouraged to use the financial aid information resources provided by Saint Louis University. SLU offers workshops and webinar programs to address generic financial aid questions including FAFSA-related issues. Go to: slu.edu/financial-aid, or call: 314-977-2350 for more information.

A+ PROGRAM

All parents should consider complet-

ing the "A+ Intent to Comply Form" available on the DHS website (Bottom of the site to "Students", then "Forms"). Completed forms should be turned-in to Mr. Tinsley in the guidance office. The A+ program offers significant tuition assistance at community colleges and some four-year colleges.

Seniors and their parents should be aware that the qualifying score for the Bright Flight Scholarship has increased to the ACT score of 32 (previously 31). Contact Mr. Tinsley in the guidance office if you have questions.




