Hi all,

Last week I mentioned my plan to see *Killers of the Flower Moon*. Here's what I knew going in: the movie was directed by Scorsese, stared DiCaprio, was adapted from highly regarded source material, and it had something to do with the genesis of the FBI. That was it, and when I am anticipating a work of art like I was eagerly anticipating *Killers of the Flower Moon*, I try to know as little as possible. I avoid trailers and reviews; I even turn my head away from movie posters. I try to encounter the work with as little bias as possible. Then afterwards, I dig into all of the secondary material and use that to help me articulate my own thoughts and feelings. The rest of this letter will lay out those initial thoughts, without revealing any plot points. So, if you haven't seen the movie yet and are like me, beware.

The movie did not disappoint, the acting especially. DiCaprio, Robert De Niro, and Lily Gladstone, were exceptional. As I said, I hadn't seen any previews and had assumed that DiCaprio was going to play the hero/FBI investigator. Instead, he turns in a chilling performance as the somewhat dimwitted naif, Earnest Burkhart. We first see him upon his arrival to a small town. He seems to take delight in the "wild west" style violence around him, and we hear him declare a love of women and money. These three vices will plague DiCaprio's character throughout the film, and when combined with the character's dimwitted nature mark him as easy prey for his uncle, played by De Niro.

De Niro's King Hale is a genial demon. Last week my Contemporary Issues class read Nathaniel Hawthorne's "Young Goodman Brown." In the story, Goodman Brown goes to the woods to meet a man who looks like his father but is clearly the devil. The class discussed why such a figure would be more difficult to deny than the more classically drawn devils we will see this Halloween. De Niro captures this type of familiar Satan better than anyone I've seen on screen, slowly dripping poison into Burkhart's ear.

While De Niro and DiCaprio turn in some of their best performances, they are outshined by the subtly of Lily Gladstone's Mollie. Dana Stevens in her <u>review of the movie for Slate</u> notes that, "Mollie is quiet, watchful, reserved—but never stoic or pitiably long-suffering in the style of a stereotypical onscreen 'Indian.' We see her experiencing longing, lust, grief, suspicion, forgiveness, and fury, even as she's obliged to conceal her true feelings—and the extent of her awareness of the deceit all around her." What I find remarkable about Gladstone's performance is that she communicates everything Stevens suggests with very few lines, compelling the audience to watch her face as she reacts to the world around her.

I've only touched on the performances. The film is also stunningly beautiful. If you have the stamina to sit in a theater for three and a half hours, I strongly recommend it.
