

Hello all,

As we approach the end of the year, I'd like to take a moment to remind/explain to everyone how we coordinate Baccalaureate Mass, Graduation, Junior Week of Service, and final exams. If you are a freshman or sophomore, the end of the second semester will look much like the end of the first. We will have an All School Mass and Reading Day on May 23rd, the day before final exams. Freshmen and sophomores will start the day (7:45) in their Communios. Mass will begin around 8:00. After Mass, the students will have until noon to meet with teachers for any last minute finals preparation. Finals will then take place over the next three days: Periods 1, 2 and 3 on May 24th, periods 4, 5, and 6 on May 25th, and periods 7 and 8 on May 26th.

The end of the semester for juniors and seniors is a little more complicated. To accommodate Junior Week of Service and Graduation, juniors and seniors will take their finals on May 10th, 11th, and 12th. Those days will be regular school days for our freshmen and sophomores; the finals schedule needs to adjust to allow for the fact that underclassmen will still be attending regular classes. May 9th will be reading day for our juniors and seniors. They are not required to be on campus, but can use the day to meet with teachers in preparation for their finals. May 9th will be a regular day of school for our freshmen and sophomores; upperclassmen looking for finals preparation will need to coordinate with their teachers. On May 10th, upperclassmen will take their period 7 final (7:45-8:35), period 1 final (9:55-10:45), and their period 2 final (1:05-1:55). On May 11th upperclassmen will take their period 8 final (7:45-8:35), period 2 final (9:55-10:45), and their period 5 final (1:05-1:55). On May 12th upperclassmen will take their period 3 final (9:55-10:45) and their period 6 final (1:05-1:55). Upperclassmen only need to be on campus when they are taking a final.

We will also have a couple of Power Hours to help all of our students prepare for the end of the semester. The first Power Hour will be on Wednesday April 26th. I will not have any formal professional development planned for our teachers. Instead they will be in their classrooms from 7:45-8:45 and available to help students prepare for the end of the quarter and final exams. We will have another Power Hour with the same structure on May 17, prior to finals for our freshmen and sophomores.

Finally, a quarterly reminder of how we determine grades. Duchesne divides the academic year into semesters and quarters. Semester grades are the only grades that are presented on a student's transcript. They are also the only grades used to determine a student's cumulative GPA. We figure semester grades using the following calculations: the first quarter is worth 40% of the grade, the second quarter is worth 40%, and the final is worth 20%.
